

Grootlosie van Suid-Afrika

VERKLARING.

Nademaal Vrymesselary sedert 1772 in Suider-Afrika onder die Groot Ooste van die Nederlande beoefen is en gedy het onder die heilsame bestuur van hierdie Groot Ooste, het die Nederlandse Losies op Saterdag, 18 Februarie 1961 in Kaapstad vergader en besluit om 'n Grootlosie in Suider-Afrika in die lewe te roep om Vrymesselary te bevorder met besondere verwysing na die Aloue Opdragte. Die Grootlosie van Suider-Afrika is daarna in Kaapstad gestig en het onmiddellike erkenning van die Grootlosies van Engeland, Ierland, Skotland en Holland ontvang. Hierdie Grootlosie vereis dat elke kandidaat vir toelating tot die Orde onder sy jurisdiksie ondubbelsinnig die volgende grondbeginsels onderskryf:

- (1) Dat die eerste voorwaarde vir toelating tot lidmaatskap van die Orde 'n geloof in 'n Opperwese is, na wie Vrymesselary verwys as die Opper Boumeester van die Heelal (DOBVDH) en Sy geopenbaarde wil soos vervat in die Boek van die Heilige Wet (DBVDHW). Dit is 'n essensiële voorwaarde en laat geen kompromie toe nie.
- (2) Dat die Bybel of soortgelyke boek, onderhewig aan elke lid se geloof, en waarna Vrymesselaars verwys as DBVDHW, sal altyd oop lê in elke Losie gedurende arbeid. Elke kandidaat sal sy verpligtinge op dié Boek of Volume aflê wat kragtens sy besondere geloof onskendbaarheid verleen aan die eed of belofte wat daarop geneem is.
- (3) Dat die Drie Groot Ligte van Vrymesselaary (naamlik DBVDHW, die Winkelhaak en die Passer) moet altyd tydens formele vergaderinge (arbeid) van elke Losie vertoon word. Hiervan is DBVDHW die belangrikste.
- (4) Dat elke man wat tot Vrymesselary toetree streng verbied word om hom met enige daad te vereenselwig wat die vrede en goeie orde van die samelewing omver kan werp. Hy moet gehoorsaamheid aan die wette van enige Staat waarin hy woon of wat beskerming aan hom verleen betoon en hy mag nooit in gebreke bly in die nakoming van sy verskuldigde trou aan die Staatshoof van sy land nie, niteenstaande sy politieke siening nie.
- (5) Dat terwyl Vrymesselary onder die Grootlosie van Suid Afrika op hierdie wyse gehoorsaamheid aan die Staat en sy lede se verantwoordelikhede as burgers teenoor die Staat by elkeen van sy lede inskerp, gun die Grootlosie die individu sy eie siening oor sake van openbare belang. Geen lid mag egter in die Losie of ter enige tyd in sy hoedanigheid as 'n Vrymesselaar sy siening oor godsdienstige en of politieke kwessies bespreek of probeer bevorder nie.
- (6) Dat die Grootlosie 'n hoë premie op elke persoon se individualiteit stel asook sy sedelike aanspreeklikheid vir al sy handelinge, die fundamentele gelykheid van alle persone, die universele broederskap van die mens en elke persoon se plig om hom met toewyding tot die welsyn van die gemeenskap te beywer.
- (7) Dat die Grootlosie hom weerhou, tuis en in die buiteland, van enige kommentaar oor sake rakende

Grand Lodge of South Africa

DECLARATION.

Whereas Freemasonry was introduced in Southern Africa under the authority of the Grand East of the Netherlands during 1772 and having flourished exceedingly well under the benign rule of this Grand East, the Lodges operating under the jurisdiction of this Grand East assembled in Cape Town on Saturday, 18 February 1961 and determined on the formation of a Grand Lodge in Southern Africa for the furtherance of Freemasonry with especial reference to the Ancient Charges. The Grand Lodge of Southern Africa was thereafter established at Cape Town and received immediate recognition from the United Grand Lodge of England, the Grand Lodges of Ireland and Scotland and the Grand East of the Netherlands and demands that a prerequisite to admission to the Order is that every member shall unequivocally subscribe to the following basic principles:

- (1) That the first condition of admission into and membership of the Order is a belief in a Supreme Being, referred to generally by Freemasons as the Great Architect of the Universe (GAOTU) and His revealed will as contained in the Volume of the Sacred Law (VSL). This is essential and admits no compromise.
- (2) That the Holy Bible or such similar book, depending on the individual faith of every member, referred to by Freemasons as the Volume of the Sacred Law, shall always be open in every Lodge when it is at labour. Every candidate is required to take his Obligations on that Book or Volume, which is held by his particular faith to impart sanctity to an oath or promise taken upon it.
- (3) That the Three Great Lights of Freemasonry (viz. the Volume of the Sacred Law, the Square and the Compasses) shall be exhibited in every Lodge when it is at work, the chief of these being the Volume of the Sacred Law.
- (4) That every man who enters Freemasonry is strictly forbidden to countenance any act which may have a tendency to subvert the peace and good order of society; that he must pay due obedience to the Law of any State in which he resides or which may afford him protection and that he must never be remiss in the allegiance due by him to the Head of State of his country, irrespective of his political affiliation.
- (5) That while Freemasonry under the Grand Lodge of South Africa inculcates in each of its members the duties of loyalty and citizenship, it reserves to the individual the right to hold his own opinion with regard to public affairs but forbids all members, whether in Lodge or at any time in his capacity as a Freemason, to discuss or to advance his views on religious or political questions.
- (6) That the Grand Lodge acknowledges the high value of human personality, man's moral responsibility for all his actions, the fundamental equality of all human beings, the universal brotherhood of man and every man's duty to labour with devotion for the welfare of the community.
- (7) That the Grand Lodge refuses to express any opinion

buitelandse of binnelandse Staatsbeleid. Dit sal verder nie toelaat dat sy naam gekoppel word aan enige handelinge, ongeag die skynbare humanitêre aard daarvan nie, wat inbreuk maak op sy onwrikbare beleid van onpartydigheid wat alle kwessies rakende betrekkinge tussen regerings of tussen politieke partye betref of botsende teorieë oor Staatsvorme nie.

- (8) Dat die Grootlosie volstrek weier om hom te vereenselwig met liggame wat hulle voordoen as Vrymesselaars, maar wat nie hierdie grondbeginsels onderskryf nie. Dit sal ook nie deelneem aan konferensies met sogenaamde internasionale organisasies wat lidmaatskap verleen aan persone of liggame wat hulle nie streng by hierdie beginsels hou nie. Die Grootlosie sal ook nie deur so 'n organisasie verteenwoordig word nie.
- (9) Dat daar niks geheimsinnig is wat die grondbeginsels van Vrymesselary betref nie. Die Grootlosie sal altyd oorweging skenk aan die erkenning van en sal erkenning soek by enige Grootlosie wat hierdie gevestigde en ongewysigde beginsels bely en of bedryf het. In geen omstandighede sal dit aan 'n gesprek deelneem wat daarop gemik is om 'n nuwe of gewysigde vertolking van hierdie beginsels te gee nie. Hierdie beginsels moet in die geheel volmondig bely en bedryf word deur diegene wat as Vrymesselaars erken wil word. Die Grootlosie sal verder geen betrekkinge aanknoop met enige Grootlosie wat op 'n vriendskaplike voet verkeer met enige persoon of liggaam wat hom nie streng by hierdie basiese beginsels hou nie.
- (10) Dat die Grootlosie 'n soewereine en onafhanklike liggaam is wat oor soewereine mag oor Losies onder sy beheer beskik. Dit is 'n verantwoordelike, onafhanklike, selfregerende organisasie met uitsluitlike gesag oor die Vak en Simboliese Grade binne sy jurisdiksie. Dit erken nie die bestaan van enige hoër Masonieke gesag nie, hoe dit ookal beskryf word.
- (11) Dat die stigting van die "Grootlosie van Aloue, Vry en Aangenome Messelaars van Suider-Afrika" in 1961 as 'n soewereine en onafhanklike Grootlosie deur Losies met Oktrooie van die Groot Ooste van die Nederlande in die Republiek van Suid-Afrika, Rhodesië en in Suid-Wes Afrika in geen opsig die regte en voorregte van enige Losie met 'n Magtingsbrief van die Verenigde Grootlosie van Engeland, die Grootlosie van Ierland en die Grootlosie van Skotland, wat nog altyd Masonieke gesag op gelyke voet in die genoemde oop gebiede gedeel het, sal aantas nie en dat hulle in hulle diskresie Oktrooie aan nuwe Losies sal kan toestaan. Dit is die wens van die Grootlosie van Suid-Afrika dat hierdie harmonieuse gesindheid en gelykheid wat betref gesag in die toekoms, soos in die verlede, sal voortbestaan en verklaar hierby uitdruklik:
- (a) Dat al die Losies en die Koninklike Gewelfkapittels van Engelse, Ierse en Skotse oorsprong steeds erken sal word op 'n grondslag van absolute gelykheid.
- (b) Dat die Verenigde Grootlosie van Engeland, die Grootlosie van Ierland en die Grootlosie van Skotland steeds die bevoegdheid sal hê om in hulle diskresie nuwe Oktrooie uit te

on questions of foreign or domestic State policy, either at home or abroad and it will not allow its name to be associated with any action, however humanitarian it may appear to be, which infringes its unalterable policy of standing aloof from every question affecting the relations between Governments or between political parties or questions as to rival theories of Government.

- (8) That the Grand Lodge refuses absolutely to have any relationship with bodies, styling themselves as Freemasons, which do not adhere to these basic principles; nor will it participate in any conference with so-called international associations which admit to membership bodies which fail to conform strictly to these principles and it shall not be represented by any such association.
- (9) That there is no secret with regard to any of the basic principles of Freemasonry. The Grand Lodge will always consider the recognition of and seek recognition by those Grand Lodges which profess and practice and can show that they have consistently professed and practiced these established and unaltered principles, but in no circumstances will it enter into discussion with a view to any new or varied interpretation of them. These principles must be accepted and practiced wholeheartedly and in their entirety by those who desire to be recognized as Freemasons under this Grand Lodge. Furthermore, the Grand Lodge will not enter into any relationship with a Grand Lodge which is in amity with any body, which does not adhere strictly to these basic principles.
- (10) That the Grand Lodge is a sovereign and independent body and shall have sovereign jurisdiction over all the Lodges under its control being a responsible, independent, self-governing organisation with sole authority over the Craft of Symbolic Degrees within its jurisdiction. It does not recognize nor admit the existence of any superior Masonic authority in the Republic of South Africa, however styled.
- (11) That the establishment of "The Grand Lodge of Ancient, Free and Accepted Masons of Southern Africa" as a sovereign and independent Grand Lodge by the Lodges holding Charters from the Grand East of the Netherlands in the Republic of South Africa, in Rhodesia and in South West Africa in 1961, did not affect the rights and privileges enjoyed by any Lodges holding a Warrant from the United Grand Lodge of England, the Grand Lodge of Ireland and the Grand Lodge of Scotland which have always shared these Masonic jurisdictions on an equal basis in the said open territories and have granted Charters for new Lodges at their discretion. The Grand Lodge of Southern Africa desired that this harmonious relationship and equality of jurisdiction should continue in the future as in the past and hereby expressly declared then and does so now:
- (a) That all the Lodges and Royal Arch Chapters of English, Irish and Scottish origin shall continue to be recognised on the basis of absolute equality.
- (b) That the United Grand Lodge of England, the Grand Lodge of Ireland and the Grand Lodge of Scotland shall continue to have the right to

- (c) Dat die bestaan van die Grootlosie van Suider-Afrika as 'n onafhanklike Grootlosie nie die stigting van tyd tot tyd in oop gebiede deur die Verenigde Grootlosie van Engeland, die Grootlosie van Ierland en die Grootlosie van Skotland en hulle onderskeie Distriks- en Provinsiale Grootlosies en Dogterlosies van 'n ander of ander Grootlosies, met uitsluitlike gesag in oop gebiede oor die Vak en Simboliese Grade onder hulle administratiewe beheer, uitsluit nie.
- (12) Dat die lidmaatskap van die Grootlosie en die individuele Losies onder sy jurisdiksie uitsluitlik uit mans sal bestaan en dat elke Losie geen Masonieke gemeenskap van enige aard met gemengde Losies of liggame wat vroue toelaat sal hê nie.
- (13) Dat die beginsels van die Aloue Landmerke, sedes en gebruike van die Vak stiptelik nagekom sal word.

Grootlosie van suid-Afrika.

Met die toestemming van die Verenigde Grootlosie van Engeland en die Grootlosies van Ierland en Skotland is die naam van die Grootlosie van Suider-Afrika op 8 Junie 1979 en na verdere samesprekings met die Grootlosie van Engeland, verander na die Grootlosie van Suid-Afrika, welke naam op 8 Oktober 1979 bekragtig is. Waar die naam Suider-Afrika dus voorkom, moet dit gelees word as Suid-Afrika.

Grootlosie van Suid-Afrika

DOELWIT

Dit is die doelwit van hierdie Grootlosie:

- (1) om alle vry denkende mans wat streef tot of wat alreeds bydra tot 'n vreedsame en armoede vry gemeenskap aan te moedig om lede te word.
- (2) om alle lede aan te moedig om hoë morele en etiese standaarde in hulle daaglikse lewens te handhaaf.
- (3) om elke lid aan te moedig om sy gelowigheid te bevorder en uit te brei en om dit met alle ander persone te deel.
- (4) om 'n goeie man 'n beter man te maak deur hom aan te moedig om die lesse wat hy in DBVDHW, die Rituale en in die Beginsels van die Orde leer, te ken, te verstaan en te beoefen.
- (5) om die ontwikkeling van elke lid se sosiale en gelowige gesindheid aan te moedig om sodoende sy swakhede te kan verstaan en oor te kom.
- (6) om elke lid te bemagtig om die lesse wat hy geleer het in sy gemeenskap toe te pas om dit sodoende te verhef.
- (7) om die konsepte van waarheid, integriteit, broederliefde en liefdadigheid in elke lid te bevorder sodat dit 'n deel word van sy leefwyse.

grant new Charters for new Lodges (and Royal Arch Chapters) at their discretion, until the formation of a "United Grand Lodge of Southern Africa" by the four Constitutions acting by mutual agreement.

- (c) That the existence of the Grand Lodge of Southern Africa as a sovereign and independent Grand Lodge shall not preclude the establishment in the open territories from time to time by the United Grand Lodge of England, the Grand Lodges of Ireland and Scotland and their respective District and Provincial Grand Lodges and daughter Lodges of another or other Grand Lodges with sole and sovereign Masonic jurisdiction in the open territories over the Craft and Symbolic degrees within their administration.
- (12) That the membership of the Grand Lodge and individual Lodges shall be composed exclusively of men and that every Lodge shall have no Masonic intercourse of any kind with mixed Lodges or bodies which admit women to its / their membership.
- (13) That the principles of the Ancient Landmarks, customs and usages of the Craft shall be strictly observed.

Grand Lodge of South Africa.

With the consent of the United Grand Lodge of England and the Grand Lodges of Ireland and Scotland, the name of the Grand Lodge of Southern Africa was changed to the Grand Lodge of South Africa following discussions with the United Grand Lodge of England on 8 June 1979 and confirmed on 8 October 1979. Consequently, wherever the name "Southern Africa" appears, it shall be read as South Africa.

Grand Lodge of South Africa

**Annual Report of the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of South Africa.
Die Grootmeester van die Grootloosie van Suid Afrika se Jaarverslag.
2023/2024**

It is my pleasure to present the Annual report of the Grand Lodge of South Africa for the Masonic year August 2023 to July 2024. This report will be circulated to all members of our Grand Lodge, so it can be read prior to the Annual General Meeting in Cape held in Cape Town on the 7 September 2024. I will address certain aspects of the report at the meeting. The full report will also be published in the Yearbook 2024 and will be available on Grand View.

I believe that to enjoy Freemasonry, we must have fun practicing it. It is said that that doing something which is enjoyable, takes very little effort. There are however times when we are required to attend to things which don't seem like fun and which appear to require a considerable effort, but we must not let those tasks detract from the overall enjoyment of doing and practicing what we love. We continue to reap countless benefits from the GAOTU, often without the realisation thereof.

One of the objectives I set this past year, was to listen to what the membership was saying, to be able to remove stumbling blocks which interfere with their having fun. However, not all "moans" required intervention, but rather a change of perspective.

In the late 19th century Benjamin Disraeli stated that change is both constant and inevitable, and it has never been a truer statement than today when we look at the world around us. It also applies to our various organisations. Although we voluntarily joined our Order, we will gain much knowledge and gain many skills as we progress on our various journeys. What we fail to realise is that the skills and knowledge we acquire, are changing us, hopefully for the better.

LEADERSHIP.

The leadership structure of Grand Lodge has departed from the Annual Leadership

Conference hosted in Bloemfontein to holding “five mini leadership workshops” annually around the country, embracing new ideas and setting goals and targets for the Divisions, as well as Grand Lodge. This is in keeping with the new Grand Lodge ethos identified in the very first of these mini conferences in September last year of “How can we help you?”. It was through this process that we were able to publish the Vision, Mission and Value statement of the Grand Lodge, with these now being displayed in all the venues where we meet.

The Annual Leadership Conference this year held in March in Bloemfontein, addressed a specific aspect, that of a unified acceptance of the roles and responsibilities of lodge officers and with group breakaway sessions where the groups for these sessions were constantly mixed up, led to robust exchange of ideas and experiences. We all know that our experiences in life determine our beliefs, and this was evident in the wide-ranging interpretations of the roles of the various officers in the Lodges. In the end there was a far greater acceptance that Freemasonry as practiced around the Country differs in small ways, and the Provincial Grand Masters were tasked with taking the outcomes of the conference and drafting a common understanding of the roles of the principal officers of the Lodges. This has been completed and the revised roles now published for a common understanding of what is expected of each officer to be able to create an enjoyable environment for our members.

I must thank everyone who participated in these sessions, for the frank and honest debates, and in forging a strong leadership group across all divisions. I thank the Deputy Grand Master and the Provincial Grand Masters for the considerable efforts required in completing this task.

MEMBERSHIP.

An analysis of the membership of the Grand Lodge presented a disturbing picture. Over the past 10 or more years, there has been on average a 7% decline in membership of our Grand Lodge.

We continue to experience an attrition rate which must be arrested. Our fraternity loses as many existing members as we initiate each year. One of the common reasons given for this is economic hardships rendering members unable to pay their dues.

We cannot afford to have this trend continue, and interventions have started to understand reasons for this and methods to be employed to reverse the trend and see positive growth result from our efforts to reverse the negative trend.

Discussions were held with every Provincial Grand Master (and acting Provincial Grand Masters at the time) before my term as Grand Master commenced. They were asked to provide their understanding of what makes a viable division, in terms of finance and membership. All provided plans and budgets for the various divisions. Some targets for membership growth were extremely generous, and in the end every Provincial Grand Master agreed to a target (based on his plan) to grow membership in his Division. The plan looked at areas where growth could happen, which would include the establishment of new Lodges in areas where the Grand Lodge of South Africa currently has no presence (sometimes going back to areas where we had such presence in the past).

Achieving the agreed Grand Master’s growth target would be considered success, achieving his own target would be even better, but failure would be viewed in the appropriate light. The results over the Grand Lodge Masonic year have been in general disappointing as the continued attrition at the end of the financial year occurred. Only One Division was able to meet the agreed growth target.

An analysis of the attrition has provided food for thought. We were blessed to have very few members pass to the Eternal East. Some members have emigrated, but sadly a large number of members were excluded for non-payment of their dues. Some Lodges were carrying far too many members on paper, who never set their feet inside the Lodge, and who failed to pay their dues. We are aware of the financial hardships which our Country faces,

and that some economic areas are affected to a greater degree than others. Losing a member who falls on hard times due to retrenchment, etc. is sad, as there are ways and means that they, together with other members in the Lodge, can raise funds to cover the essential amounts due. We hope that these initiatives are embraced in the course of this year and that such statistics will be no longer reported.

The collection rate in the 2023 financial year was poor, and I must thank the Provincial Grand Masters for working with the Grand Treasurer in recouping much of the money which was not paid by the end of December 2023. Having listened to the members, and fine tuning the billing system, it appears that members are making their payments timeously and interventions are in place where some members are falling behind in their obligations.

Growth targets for the 2024/25 Masonic year have been put in place with performances to be reviewed over the coming year. Results of the Survey completed by our divisions, has provided vital information which will assist us in changing the trend and seeing growth occur.

It was discovered that the applications through the Grand Lodge Website appeared to suffer from a breakdown. An extract of all applications logged between May 2023 and June 2024 yielded some 1211 potential candidates. These were screened and those who indicated the wrong reasons for wanting to join the Order were removed. The screened lists were sorted into Divisions and circulated to the Provincial Grand Masters who have been tasked, together with their leadership group (all Provincial Grand Lodge Officers) to contact suitable candidates with a view to attracting them to the order.

The “push” process on the Website is being reviewed, with a new application form being devised whereby unsuitable candidates are taken out the system before being pushed to the relevant Division for contact and consideration.

RESOURCES AND ADMINISTRATION.

A review of resources within the Grand Lodge

was undertaken. A concern we identified was that over the past years the intellectual capital of the Grand Lodge had become vested in too few people. This is a great risk to the organisation and steps have been identified to change this. Discussions were held with the Grand Secretary, MW Bro Geoffrey Edwards, OSM, who carries the bulk of the administrative burden on his shoulders. My thanks go to the Grand Secretary, MW Bro Geoffrey Edwards, OSM, for his continued support and dedication to numerous aspects of the running of our Grand Lodge and for his support in identifying likely successors to take over the many roles that he performs.

We agreed that a suitable person be identified to assist in the publication of the monthly Square and Compass newsletter. Such a resource was not easy to find, but after discussions with Bro Manny De Freitas, the responsibility of the monthly production of the newsletter has moved off the desk of the Grand Secretary, who still casts his beady eye over this to endure accuracy of information therein. Bro Manny De Freitas has introduced a fresh new look to the Square and Compasses publication.

The Grand View system and the administration thereof has also been reviewed. Ideas are being formulated to remove the requirement to double or triple handle information. Such interventions will not be implemented until they have been thoroughly reviewed and tested, and thanks again goes to the Grand Secretary for maintaining the system. Access to the back end of the system is required to understand how data is managed in the system, and how we can integrate our processes into the system, improving efficiency in what we do.

A few years ago, the financial system was centralised, with the establishment of the FNB banking platform. A system where payments would be made on behalf of Lodges was established. The intention was, according to the Grand Treasurer, to eventually migrate this responsibility to another person, other than his wife. This is now starting to happen, and a word of thanks must go to Mrs Mari Topham for running this side of the business for the past three or more years. The migration of

responsibility will not see Mari's involvement end; however, her services will be retained as a very necessary back up to the party taking over this function.

CONSTITUTION.

The Constitution and Regalia Committee has been extremely active over the past year, reviewing various proposals and amendments presented to it. Thank you to the members of this important committee, who amidst their busy work schedules have found time to assist in dealing with the workload presented to them.

Any organisation must ensure that its operating procedures remain in keeping with legislation and time. Over many years, various amendments and additions were brought to the Constitution, Laws and Regulations of the Grand Lodge of South Africa. This has resulted in some disjointed aspects in it. A comprehensive review was commenced some three years ago, aligning the Constitution, Laws and Regulations of the Grand Lodge of South Africa to the Memorandum of Incorporation of our Non-Profit Company. The intention has been to consolidate the Constitution Laws and Regulations and remove the disjoint.

A word of thanks must be given to RW Bro Brandon Topham, OSM, who initiated the idea, but more recently to Wor Bro Wikus Steyl, for his commitment in presenting a realigned version for consideration by Grand Committee. The review process is unfolding, with comments being received, evaluated and incorporated. The revised Constitution Laws and Regulations will be published during the course of the next masonic year of our Grand Lodge.

A proposal was tabled for the creation of a new Grand Lodge rank, being that of Grand Chancellor. This is to align our Grand Lodge with many of the other Grand Lodges with whom we are in amity. This function was previously managed by the head of the Foreign Relations Committee through the Grand Secretary. The position was approved, together with the rank and styling befitting its stature, and this amendment has been adopted into the

Constitution, together with the approved jewel of office.

DISCIPLINE

I thank those members who uphold the dignity of our Order and live within the precepts thereof, thus avoiding such matters. We agree that we are all human, and have the right to our own ideas, beliefs and behaviour, so long as such does not disturb the harmony of the Lodge, Provincial Grand Lodge or even Grand Lodge.

We had one serious disciplinary hearing which was dealt with during the past year. It is sad to see that some members fail to live up to the expectations of the Order. We hope that the peace and harmony of the area which was disturbed by this matter, will soon return to normality, and that growth and prosperity will be the end result.

EDUCATION.

There has been much debate and planning around programmes to enhance the value proposition with regards to the educational aspect of our Order. There are programmes running in our Grand Lodge, which are not fully utilised, which will enhance the experience of our membership if correctly implemented.

The Leadership Programme which has been under development for a long time, but went through a hiatus, has been revived. Recording of new modules has commenced. Some parts are in production and are being edited, with the next phase of the process to be finalised before these are released. This will be a focus area in the next year where we hope that the programme will yield the expected results for our members as they progress in their masonic careers.

The mentorship programme had largely fallen by the wayside. In a survey conducted by the Provincial Grand Master (Northern Division), RW Bro Simon Nash, responses received indicated that retention of members was higher in Lodges and Divisions, where a formal programme is in place. RW Bro Simon Nash has undertaken to relaunch the online sessions

which will cover the three craft degrees as well as provide training for members who are identified as being suitable mentors.

PROGRAMMES.

Ritual Excellence.

This programme seeks to encourage all members to learn ritual and to present it with meaning, thus enhancing the memorable Masonic Experience of all who hear their work.

The number of participants and entrants to the programme seems to have declined. A central repository of all members and their scores has been set up, so it is possible to track progress far more easily, thereby encouraging Brethren to excel and achieve the aim of the programme which is aimed at improving your Masonic knowledge and at the same time gain experience and confidence to be able to grow personally which will stand you in good stead on your Masonic journey (as well as in your daily life). The programme's aim is not to enable you to collect lapel pins, but rather at improving the standard of our workings for the benefit of all. The awarding of a pin should be seen as encouragement to your peers to also apply themselves. Whilst not all members are ritualists, everyone can improve their own ability to present pieces of ritual to a higher standard.

Balanced Lodge Programme.

The concept of this programme was promoted by RW Bro Brandon Topham, OSM. The idea is by completing a monthly questionnaire, the management team of a lodge will be able to identify areas of their lodges performance which needs improvement or focus. It is not a tool to police lodges, but if approached correctly pinpoints aspects of what makes lodges happy places and builds a sense of pride. The programme is not a tool to police lodges but rather enables the management team of a lodge to identify areas within their lodges performance which needs improvement or focus.

There are too many Lodges who have failed to complete even a single return since the

programme was launched, others who were regular participants, have fallen off the programme with the changing of the Presiding Master of the Lodge. Others who discuss these returns at their Board of Management meetings, have understood the powerful tool at their disposal, have seen an improvement in attendance generally, as well as new members being attracted to join their ranks. Thanks must go to Bro Gerhard Muller of Lodge Prins Frederik, who volunteered to assist in the collation of data and the production of the monthly updates of the programme. Similarly, thank you to RW Bro Reuven Coenen, Lodge Golden City and Lodge Prins Frederik, for helping oversee the programme.

The Award to the most balanced Lodge for the period 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024 will be announced at the meeting and the minutes of the meeting will record the most balanced lodge.

DIVISIONS.

Southern Division.

I appointed RW Bro Thomas William Hardiman, the immediate past Provincial Grand Master (Southern Division) as my Deputy Grand Master. I appointed Wor Bro Raymond Yosimbom Eyiomen as acting Provincial Grand Master (Southern Division) in July 2023 and installed him as Provincial Grand Master (Southern Division) in September 2023. The Division saw a net growth of 5 members over the year. A concerted effort is required to expand this Division beyond the city bowl in Cape Town and to reach the many outlying areas of this large city.

Northern Division.

I appointed RW Bro Simon Philip Nash as Provincial Grand Master (Northern Division) in July 2023. The Division saw the closing of Lodge Vereeniging No 67 (again) due to lack of support from the brethren who petitioned to have the Lodge reopened. The Division had 37 initiations over the year. Some Lodges performed exceptionally well in bringing new blood into the Order, while sadly some either retained their membership or saw a net loss in membership. The Division is driven by a hard-

working Provincial Grand Master and his commissioned officers. The Division has acknowledged its challenges and has plans to grow by 20% over the next year.

The Provincial Grand Master retained his appointed commissioned officers from the previous year. New Provincial Grand Lodge officers were appointed in the Division. Only one Provincial Grand Lodge officer retired at the end of the 2023/2024 masonic year after many years loyal service. I thank Wor Bro John Weigelt for his loyal service to the Division. The Division saw their Treasurer resign (for personal reasons to allow him to study further with a view to ultimately emigrating). This key position posed challenges to the Division due to the timing thereof. The Division has appointed a Brother of Talent to assist in the role, overseen by one of the Assistant Provincial Grand Masters.

Central Division.

I appointed Wor Bro Marcel de Kock as acting Provincial Grand Master (Central Division) in July 2023 and installed him as Provincial Grand Master (Central Division) in March 2024. This Division has achieved its growth target as agreed with the Grand Master, well done to the PGM and his officers. Plans are in place to try and better their growth achieved over the past year. There is enthusiasm within the Division, and palpable energy. There are signs of economic hardship in Kimberley which has seen several people lose their employment opportunities, which will have a knock-on effect in membership.

Wor Bro Marcel De Kock appointed Wor Bro Jan Andries Coetzee and Wor Bro Francois Dauth as his Assistant Provincial Grand Masters. With a small, but growing Division, some of his Provincial Grand Officers have been appointed to more than one position.

Eastern Division.

I appointed RW Bro Johan van der Merwe as Provincial Grand Master (Eastern Division) in July 2023. The Division has been struggling to

climb out of a sadly mired period of disharmony. The Division carried out 4 initiations in the three Lodges making up the Division but achieved a net loss of three members over the year.

The Eastern Division with its small membership base, has very few members to draw on to fill all positions in a Provincial Grand Lodge. Most Provincial Grand Lodge Officers retained their appointments for the next year. To enable the Division to turn out a full Provincial Grand Lodge Team to attend to official call outs, the Provincial Grand Master applied for dispensation, which was granted, to appoint lodge wardens who had not yet been appointed as a Master of the Lodge to act as Provincial Grand Stewards.

In May 2023, I approached the Past Provincial Grand Master, RW Bro Frans Roodt, and discussed appointing him as an Assistant Grand Master in the Division a challenge he accepted. He was appointed with immediate effect and was obligated and invested in his new role at the Annual General Meeting of the Northern Division in July 2024. RW Bro Frans Roodt has already set plans in place to assist the Provincial Grand Master and the division to claw back members and bring in new members to our Grand Lodge.

Eastern Cape Division.

I appointed RW Bro Keith John Hutton OSM, as Assistant Grand Master in July 2023. I appointed Wor Bro Ricardo Gillmer as acting Provincial Grand Master in July 2023 and installed him as Provincial Grand Master in November 2023. Wor Bro James Lidderd was installed as Deputy Provincial Grand Master with Wor Bro Ian Foster Hetherington and Wor Bro Paul Nesbit West as Assistant Provincial Grand Masters in November 2023. Wor Bro West unexpectedly resigned in December 2023.

Wor Bro James Lidderd was expelled from the Order following a Disciplinary Procedure brought against him. This left the Provincial Grand Lodge rather light and after consultation with me, the Provincial Grand Master

appointed Wor Bro Hendrik Rademeyer as an acting Assistant Provincial Grand Master.

The growth target for the year was not achieved due to resignations which outnumbered the 5 initiations which took place. The fallout from the disciplinary procedure referred to earlier in this address will influence the Division in the short term, but with solid leadership and focus on rebuilding will see that effect reversed. Notwithstanding these challenges, the Division has a plan to grow its numbers to a total of 80 members over the next year

Namibia.

Lodge Makalani, in Grootfontein celebrated their Golden Jubilee (50th year) this past year. The work which they do in their community, often without much fanfare continues to make a difference in their town. With Freemasonry spread far and wide in this vast country (emphasis on far) these Brethren, demonstrate their commitment to the craft by working closely with the sister constitutions. A generous donation was presented to a facility in Grootfontein, which cares for the less privileged in their community at their 50th anniversary celebration.

BENEVOLENCE

In an effort to bring some cheer to many people who are less fortunate than ourselves, I challenged our Lodges to “bake” or buy “cookies/biscuits” which would then be packaged for distribution to the needy in society over the festive season. While some Lodges supported the initiative, others took the easy way out and donated money towards purchasing biscuits. I thank one and all who participated in the Cookie Challenge, as close to 800kg of biscuits were collected and repackaged and distributed around the country. The experiences of those who participated in the distribution, spoke volumes as to how they were affected by such a drive. At a feeding scheme supported in the Northern Division, the adults stood back to ensure that as many children as possible benefitted in receiving small packets of biscuits, much to their great delight.

I chose as my theme for the year, assistance to those in society who suffer from Alzheimer’s and Dementia. Lodge Jeffrey’s Bay donated a large number of items to those suffering from these dreaded diseases in the Jeffrey’s Bay area. A similar intervention was done in the Eastern Division with the Provincial Grand Master and his team also distributing items amongst their community, with this being covered in the local press.

The partner of the Presiding Master of Lodge Golden City undertook to make several “wet pack bags” herself. These were collected and distributed to residents of the Masonic Haven in Pretoria, at the same time as biscuits from the Cookie challenge.

Members of Lodge Prins Frederik who had received a donation of body shampoo (bulk totalling some 800 litres) bottled 500ml bottles which have been distributed to the Walking Tall With Pride Feeding Scheme, the Louis Botha Children’s Home, the Johannesburg Children’s Home and the residents of the Masonic Haven.

In Cape Town, Wor Bro Gary Hendricks continues to run the feeding scheme which he commenced in 2017, where over 200 meals are served to the less fortunate in the community, as well as the daily calling at his gate seeking help in the form of a sandwich. He also makes little food pack parcels which include rice, mielie meal, veggies and meaty bones which are handed to families that are known to put these parcels to good use in their homes. The initiative is supported by some of the Lodges and members of the Southern Division, as well as donations from members in other Divisions.

The Eastern Cape Division sponsored a playpark jungle gym for an impoverished community in Port Elizabeth. Lodge Jeffrey’s Bay donated 40kg in response to the “Cookie Challenge” which were distributed to the poor in the local community. The Lodge distributed a ton of fruit which had been donated by a local farmer to the Amala Health Care facility. They also presented Teddy Bears to the local Alzheimer patients in Jeffreys Bay, as part of the Grand Lodge programme. Members of Lodge Tolerance and Losie Sonheuwel from

Gqeberha, in collaboration with the Scottish Constitution members, collected tinned food for the Buffelsfontein Old Age Home. The Brethren of Lodge Tolerance donated over 30 bags of clothing to an exceptionally impoverished settlement on the outskirts of Gqeberha. Bro Siviwe Blauw and Bro Ericc Dyer played a key role in identifying and collecting the second-hand clothing items.

In the Central Division Lodge Peace and Harmony collected approximately 30kg of cookies which were distributed to children at a local school. The members also support some needy community members with monthly with food parcels.

The Eastern Division collected in excess of 100kg of biscuits in response to the Cookie Challenge and donated these to the Elders' Voice organisation. Members then collected and donated 100 Teddy Bears specially prepared for dementia patients to the KZN Care Association. The Division received approximately R 11,000 worth of chocolates which were distributed to the Elders' Voice as well as 45kg of frozen chicken fillets.

This goes to show that we can make a difference in the world in which we live. No matter how small our contributions may seem, they are so well received and greatly appreciated, the more we do the greater the impact on society in general.

OBITUARIES.

During the past year, we lost 2 Grand Lodge Officers. RW Bro Bernard Neuhaus, Past Grand Senior Warden, was a 60-year jewel holder. Wor Bro Paul Nash, Past Grand Inner Guard, who had been a member for 13 years.

We are aware of several members who have passed away, or lost family members over the year. We hope and pray that their lives are adjusting to the new dynamics in their families. Such losses are sadly inevitable, but never easy to accept, no matter how one prepares for them. We are taught that the sun will eventually break through the dark clouds of grief and that those that mourn will be able to smile again.

PUBLIC RELATIONS.

I have advocated the fact that we as an organisation need to command more airtime in our communities. We should see every opportunity which is presented to us to do good in our community, as an opportunity to get some possible coverage in the local community newspapers. By being proud of what we do and who we are will expose our Lodges to potential members to may wish to join our Order.

The Grand Lodge was invited to appear on the 702 radio station to discuss Freemasonry with Relebogile Mabotja. Despite the brevity of the time on air, it was apparent that we need to secure more of such opportunities. Such opportunities exist all over the country where there are local community radio stations. By having the right persons appear "on air" will afford us an opportunity to get into the homes of thousands of people where we can shed the light of knowledge and hopefully attract good men of good repute to want to join our Order. This is a challenge to be embraced and driven in the next year. Imagine a "Master Class for Freemasonry" on Radio 702 for the next year, with Relebogile Mabotja or similar radio personality, at least once a month to showcase Freemasonry.

We must be proud of our history and record it. To this end, the Annual Yearbook is compiled. Thankyou MW Bro David James Duncan, OSM, for once again collecting and publishing the 2023 version. This yearbook is available on GrandView. MW Bro Dave Duncan, OSM, identified that the current website does not have any of our yearbooks available for interested people to read. This is being attended to with these being uploaded onto the website.

Provincial Web Sites have been established and some have already been launched. These web sites will provide a basis for interaction with people in their relevant divisions. These will provide a platform for social media campaigns, as well as driving relevance in the communities where lodges meet and operate. The Grand Lodge Website is undergoing a makeover. This was held back with the view of getting Divisional Websites up and functional before

tackling the Grand Lodge site. All websites will link to each other which increases the visibility of the Grand Lodge on search engines, providing additional opportunities for public awareness.

FOREIGN RELATIONS.

Our Grand Lodge has very close relationship with the Grand Lodge of Benin. This initiative saw the memorandum of Co-operation between the two Grand Lodges being signed in May 2023. At the same time, a twinning arrangement and agreement was put in place between Lodge De Goede Hoop, No 1 and the newest Lodge in Benin, Lodge Alliance No 50, which was consecrated with the particular view to working the rituals of the Grand Lodge of South Africa and sharing information on education, and other Masonic topics between the Lodges. The Presiding Master of Lodge Alliance No 50, and the Lodge Officers were installed by the Grand Master and a team of Brethren from our Grand Lodge in Cotonou, followed by a demonstration First Degree Ceremonial working.

The weekend in Cotonou, Benin, saw the installation of the New Grand Master, MW Bro Matthieu Lawson. The delegation from our Grand Lodge received the warmest reception and were treated as guests of honour at all functions. The installation of the new Grand Master was attended to by numerous other Grand Lodges, from Quebec, France, and many African Grand Lodges. This afforded our Grand Lodge the opportunity to rekindle relationships with the African Grand Lodges, which due to circumstances had been lost.

We have been approached by numerous Grand Lodges to recognise them and enter into amity with them. Numerous invitations are also received to attend Annual Communications of many Grand Lodges around the World. It is not possible to accept many of these invitations as these often clash with events on our calendar.

The Conference of African Grand Lodges will be held in Abuja Nigeria at the end of October 2024. This Grand Lodge will be present at that conference and will also attend the installation of the Grand Master Elect as the 4th Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Nigeria. These

meetings will enable us to continue to strengthen our ties and relationships with the other Grand Lodges in Africa.

I appointed MW Bro John Ewald Henry Smith, OSM, MSA, as Chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee, as well as heading up the organising committee of the World Conference of Grand Lodges to be held in Cape Town in May 2026. The World Conference in Brazil at the end of November 2024, will provide an opportunity to continue strengthening relations with many Grand Lodges around the World. At the same time, we will have the opportunity to showcase our country and hopefully attract many visitors to the World Conference of Grand Lodges which we will host in Cape Town.

In reviewing communications received from other Grand Lodges, it was clear that these aspects are handled by a Grand Chancellor. As such, I discussed this function with MW Bro John Ewald Henry Smith, OSM, MSA and asked him to act as such in dealing with foreign Grand Lodges. I must express my thanks and gratitude to MW Bro John Ewald Henry Smith, OSM, MSA, who accepted the appointment as Chairman of our Foreign Relations Committee, for the work done in all matters relating to this important aspect of our operations.

A new post of Grand Chancellor was approved at the Grand Committee meeting held in July 2024, which hopefully will be approved by the member of the Grand Lodge of South Africa at the Annual General Meeting.

SUPREME GRAND ROYAL ARCH CHAPTER OF SOUTH AFRICA.

The Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter, is a separate but important integral part of the Grand Lodge of South Africa. The health and sustainability of our Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter, the Provincial Grand Chapters and all Chapters is dependent on the support from our craft Lodges. Under the guidance of the First Grand Principal, MEC John Ewald Henry Smith, OSM, MSA over his term of the past three years, there have been noticeable changes with new Chapters being established, new leaders being appointed, which have all

contributed to a very noticeable energy in the “Royal Arch” activities.

It has been said that in Freemasonry, family is exceptionally important. We have instances where Freemasons initiate their Lewis’ into our craft Lodges. What is more gratifying is to see the commitment to Freemasonry by the whole family. Even more so when the sons continue their Masonic journey and join appendant bodies. In August 2023 – MEC Hendrik Rademeyer, the MEZ of Chapter Jeffreys Bay in Jeffreys Bay exalted both his sons, Schalk and Adolf, into the Royal Arch degree.

In September 2023 the Provincial Grand Chapter, Southern Division installed their new Grand Superintendent, MEC Louis van der Linde. He, together with his second and third principals, are working with all the chapters in the province.

As the membership of the chapters increase, so do opportunities and we have seen a number of Cryptic Councils be revived giving further opportunities to continue with one’s Masonic education and journey.

This past year, saw two Chapters celebrate their golden jubilee. In November 2023, Chapter De Goede Kaap in Cape Town celebrated its golden jubilee, which preceded the annual installation of its Principals. In August the Brixton Lodge and Council celebrated their golden jubilee, although only having been under the banner of the GLSA for the past 6 years, the members and invited dignitaries held a luncheon in Johannesburg.

It is gratifying to see various Chapters working together and supporting each other. In January 2024 - the Brixton and Acacia Cryptic Councils held a combined installation in Johannesburg. In April 2024 – Chapter Fiat Lux and Chapter Jeffreys Bay held a combined installation in Port Alfred. Chapter Fiat Lux will be relocating to Port Elizabeth.

December 2023 saw the De Goede Kaap Royal Ark Mariner Lodge in Cape Town hold its installation.

During May 2024 MEC Geoff Edwards OSM was initiated as a Select Master in the Bellville Cryptic Council.

The installation of the new Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Benin in May 2024, saw MEC Mathieu Lawson being installed as the FGP of the SGRAC of Benin. A delegation of RA members who had accompanied me to Benin, were able to attend this installation ceremony where I represented the SGRAC of SA.

The annual convocation of the Provincial Grand Royal Arch Chapter, Northern Division was held in June 2024 in Johannesburg. I was fortunate to be able to attend the convocation which saw the First Grand Principal present a 50 yearlong-service jewel and certificate to MEC Piet Naude MSA.

The close relationship with our Sister Constitutions enabled the FGP and several senior Companions to accept an invitation in July 2024, to attend the installation of the new District Grand Mark Master of the English District Grand Mark Lodge. The Pro Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Mark Masons of England, MW Bro John Prizeman was in attendance, and the FGP was able to present a copy of the 250-year Heritage Book to him.

August 2024 saw the De Goede Kaap Royal Ark Mariner Lodge initiate MEC Geoff Edwards OSM as a member.

The administration and finances of the SGC and its two PGCs are well managed and the membership of the Chapters, Lodges and Councils is growing steadily.

The term of office of the First Grand Principal is three years, and the First Grand Principal, MEC John Ewald Henry Smith, OSM, MSA announced that he would retire at the end of his term. The Constitution of the The Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter requires that an election of his successor must be held. In March 2024 – MEC Avron Jacobson MSA was elected as the next FGP and will be installed as such in Cape Town on 28 September 2024.

I am sure that I speak on behalf of all members of the SGRAC when I express my gratitude and thanks to the retiring FGP, for his dedication to the SGRAC over his term of office. It is said that in order to build, and build sustainability, there have to be solid foundations in place. The foundations which have been laid over the past three years, building on those of his predecessor, has provided the necessary strong foundations on which the incoming FGP can continue to build.

SUPREME COUNCIL OF THE ANCIENT AND ACCEPTED SCOTTISH RITE FOR SOUTH AFRICA.

The Supreme Council is a separate and independent Masonic Order, which is made up of a large number of the members of the Grand Lodge of South Africa. It is gratifying to see that the leadership of the AASR is made up of number of members of GLSA who hold leadership positions in the craft.

As with any organisations, there are always changes to the leadership as members either retire, leave, emigrate or even get promoted. This phenomenon has occurred over the past year with a number of changes being effected at Executive level.

The efforts of members of the executive over more than 18 months, has resulted in the AASR complying with their legal obligations as a Registered Non-Profit Organisation 254-481 NPO, Non-Profit Company 2020/035499/08, Public Benefit Organisation 9046006285 PBO, Section 18A(1)(a) Tax Exempt Organisation, Registered Society with National Lotteries Commission (Reg No. 00347).

The various regions/divisions continue focus on improvement in the standard of ritual, as well as growth. These efforts are starting to yield promising results.

Shriners South Africa.

With the passing of M. Ill Bro Paul Nash, Ill Bro Maxwell Matjane was appointed as Chairman of the Shriners in South Africa. He undertook the opportunity of visiting the USA, where he met up with the MAHI Shriners of

Florida, USA from whom the Shriners South Africa derived their Charter.

The relationship with the Sister Jurisdictions in South Africa has seen visits to various important meetings across the country. Although the South African regions of the English and Wales Supreme Council as well as the Supreme Council for Scotland operate independently, all the regional ex- SGIG's have developed a strong relationship with their and our counterparts across the country.

We look forward to a mutually beneficial relationship between the GLSA and the Supreme Council of The Ancient And Accepted Scottish Rite For South Africa.

SISTER CONSTITUTIONS.

We are fortunate to continue to work in harmony with the Sister Constitutions in the Country. Many of the members of these constitutions have become friends through our common goal and ability to share thoughts and ideas on topics of common interest. Friends and colleagues are from all levels in their organisation, not restricted only to their Senior Officers. We value these inputs and the support which we as a Grand Lodge receive through the interactions at Provincial Grand Lodge level.

SPECIAL AWARDS.

A special word of thanks must be given to the membership in general for the support I have received over the first year in office. I cannot give each member a token of appreciation, other than by recognising the contributions made over the year. I look forward to even more support as we move forward. To the solid group of Brethren who accompanied me to visit Lodge Makalani last year, and again who travelled to Benin earlier this year, this support was unexpected and greatly appreciated. It showed many people, and members of other Grand Lodges that we have a vibrant, and happy Grand Lodge, willing to spread Brotherly love wherever we go.

Special awards will be made at the Annual General Meeting, in recognition of continued excellence, support and dedication not only to

our Grand Lodge, but the lodges in the various Divisions. The awards to be presented are as follows:

Secretary of the year.

The recipient will be chosen by the Grand Secretary, from nominations received, or by his close interactions with all Provincial and Lodge Secretaries over the past year.

Best Installation address.

At every installation ceremony in the Craft Lodges, the Installing Officer presents an address to the members of the Lodge. The standard of addresses to which I have been fortunate to hear, have been of a very high standard, some very thought provoking, others opening one's mind to learning and others giving guidance to all of us as Freemasons on aspects often neglected. Every installation address is required to be submitted to the Grand Secretary, and these are then sent to the senior Grand Lodge Officers (Past Grand Masters, Deputy Grand Master and the Assistant Grand Masters) to review and rate. From these assessments, one paper will stand out as being the best address delivered over the year. This paper will be published in the 2024 Yearbook.

Balanced lodge of the year.

The balanced Lodge programme as mentioned earlier, assists Lodges who diligently apply it in the management and running of the Lodge to achieve many aspects of the vision of the Grand Lodge to the betterment of Freemasonry as a whole, but particularly in our Lodges. It has brought back visiting, not only between our Lodges, but also to Lodges in our Sister Constitutions. The winning Lodge in one year, could well be surpassed by another Lodge a year later, where that Lodge applies itself to make the experience in the Lodge a truly memorable one. To stay on top of the game consistently requires a total commitment from every member in a Lodge, but if one rests on one's laurels, others will outperform you.

CONCLUSION.

It is unbelievable at how quickly the past year has past by. When I look back, I felt that the role of Grand Master was a likened to eating an elephant, and that not much has been achieved. Each teaspoon full did not seem to make the elephant any smaller.

Much has in fact been achieved, and small wins expand into bigger ones as we progress. I promised in my inaugural address, to listen more. I sincerely hope that I have lived up to this expectation and making an impact on our Grand Lodge for the right reasons. Frequent workshops with the leadership group have started to yield results. We worked tirelessly at getting the financial affairs of all Lodges and Grand Lodge into consolidated financial reports. We are constantly trying to improve our service delivery in terms of administration (we still have work to do here but are headed in the right direction). Re-establishing the various Divisional Websites, to make our Grand Lodge more visible, working on the benevolent projects (the Alzheimer and Dementia project will continue to run), the cookie challenge during the festive season.

I must extend a word of thanks to the leadership group of the Grand Lodge of South Africa, to my Deputy Grand Master, RW Bro Thomas William Hardiman, the Assistant Grand Masters RW Bro Johan Britz, MSA, RW Bro Keith John Hutton OSM, RW Bro Frans Roodt, The Grand Secretary MW Bro Geoffrey Edwards, OSM, the Grand Treasurer RW Bro Brandon Topham, OSM, all the members of Grand Committee, which includes the Provincial Grand Masters RW Bro Johan van der Merwe, RW Bro Simon Nash, RW Bro Raymond Eyiomen, RW Bro Marcel de Kock, and RW Bro Ricardo Gillmer.

This team has supported the vision of our Grand Lodge and although we may believe the wins achieved this year to be small, these will morph into much larger ones as we work to making our Grand Lodge more visible in our communities.

When reviewing the past year and reflecting on our achievements, the sacrifice of time has been worth it. It has assisted the Leadership of Grand Lodge to identify work to be done in the forthcoming year.

What makes it possible to attend to the business of Grand Lodge? Firstly, the fortune of good health bestowed on us all by the GAOTU. It is said that “Behind every successful man there is a woman, who laid a firm foundation with the bricks that others threw at him.”

This is so very true in that I am blessed to have had my wife support me very quietly, often suffering the interruptions in our family holiday to visit the children and grand children

overseas, when I had to attend to masonic matters, or numerous virtual meetings held during what others believe to be family times. I was lucky to be accompanied by Linda on the trip to Benin, where she made new friends, and where she saw another aspect of Freemasonry at work.

As we enter the next Masonic Year, let us be mindful of the obligations we have taken, to work for the benefit of every person, not only ourselves. Let us unite and strengthen the bonds of amity with our fellow Grand Lodges and freemasons all over the world. Let our Order be the change agent to make the world a better place for all who live in it. SMIB.

Installation Address – Lodge First United, #140 – by the IO, Wor Bro IO Ezeuduji – DPGM Eastern Division – 07 October 2023.

Freemasonry in South Africa, *Quo Vadis?*

Most Worshipful, Right Worshipful, Very Worshipful, Worshipful Brethren and Brethren All,

Freemasonry, just like other global fraternal and civic organisations is currently in the decline phase. It has passed through the classic product life cycle of the introduction phase – growth phase– maturity phase, and it is now in the decline phase. However, we know that products in the decline phase can be rejuvenated.

Before I continue, I want us to understand the meaning of the word “decline”, in the context of this address. I posit that Freemasonry has been declining in numbers of members but not in the strength of the value proposition of the Freemasons. The fraternity as a formally organised society has endured, as it is today for more than 300 years. It has always receded and flowed in membership numbers; however, the essence of Freemasonry has always been men in civil society who are committed to a better individual, community, and world.

Most of us, especially the Chain Officers in the Grand Lodge of South Africa, have tried to solve this decline problem, from the internal perspective: such as using covert recruitment drives, and overt retention strategies, simply because we have control over our internal environment and less or non-existent control over the external environment. We are right in doing so but must bear in mind that external factors may have more impact than internal

factors regarding the decline of Freemasonry in South Africa and globally.

We start with the external factors.

The current and ever dynamic world economy, logistics, demographics, and value system, to mention but a few, may have brought the decline in our numbers, since the late 1950s.

Freemasonry is losing its attractiveness to the younger generations (the generations Y & Z; persons born as from the early 1980s). It is becoming a club for old men. We have been astute traditionalists and less progressive. Traditions and rites are of immense value but can be made more appealing to the younger generations. Freemasonry should not be made alien and incomprehensible to the younger generations, who are born in different times and situations.

A school of thought has attributed the decline of Freemasonry to ‘power garage doors and television’. The period of Enlightenment marked the beginning of the golden period of fraternalism, which continued to grow gradually through the 19th century and peaked during the two World Wars. Power garage doors were made possible by major technological improvements made after World War II. Now when we get home, we could pull into the garage, shut the door, and never again have to interact with our neighbours. We might never need to leave the house thanks to our

smart televisions. We could just stay in. Our neighbours became aloof from us or possibly didn't know who we were. Some of the Lodges amalgamated or were forced to close once they lost their viability.

Since 2004, social fraternities have had a renaissance in the US and globally, and more and more honourable men started learning about Freemasonry. This is due to the 2004 release of the film National Treasure, which portrayed Freemasonry favourably.

Over time, society has changed. Youth are becoming increasingly interested in television, video games, the internet, etc. Additionally, people are becoming more of a "me first" generation and volunteering less than in the past. Masonry also requires faith in God or Supreme Being, which fewer people today have

due to the world's increasing secularization and the humanistic perspectives that some institutions are even teaching from. This may contribute to the decline in the number of people entering groups with a religious slant, such as masonry. The membership we do have will, however, view their membership as being even more unique because today's believers have a very fervent faith.

The government's social insurance institutions are another factor that may be overlooked. To receive assistance with unanticipated medical expenses, unemployment, or other difficult situations was indeed a primary motivation for joining. The government now offers its own form of social insurance with the money that people could have previously paid in dues. This is a good example of economists' perspective of "choice vs opportunity cost". Many of the public activities that were formerly supported and overseen by fraternal groups like Freemasonry have also been taken over by the government, globally.

Our global culture has gotten more private, which is another factor. Instead of attending neighbourhood social gatherings, some prefer to stay home with their families and watch television. Instead of relying just on others in their immediate vicinity, people use technology to create their own networks of friends.

Urbanization is a further factor. Always, rural communities had a higher level of support for fraternal institutions, such as Freemasonry, than urban ones did.

Now let's get into some of the internal factors.

If Freemasonry starts discussing significant financial commitments, that will raise big red flags. Expensive lodge operations, dues, banqueting, and gala dinner. Heavy financial commitment may function as a barrier, and the notion of membership exclusion for non-payment of dues becomes more worrisome. This is more aggravating if the committed member fell on hard times or had ill-luck.

Unfortunately, power-play and squabbles among senior members is regarded as one of the serious issues that may lead to drop in membership. Arguably, this, and Masonic burn-out, as I submitted last year (1 October 2022), can lead to experienced Freemasons leaving the organisation. Also, when younger Brethren feel no sense of belonging, they will invariably leave the organisation.

Particularly at the "side degrees" level and even at the "craft" level, freemasonry has always been very segregated. Being a Mason means having brothers and friends all around the world, but if you can't attend another Lodge because of its irregular status, that will cut you off from potential friends.

Patience is one of the first lessons we learned in the process of becoming a Mason. Going through the petitioning procedure requires some time, perhaps several months, starting with the initial expression of interest. It takes time as many Lodges only meet once a month. Usually, after reading your petition for a month, we will arrange a meeting for you and your

family with a couple of the brothers, followed by a gathering to vote on your membership. Applicants may use this time to socialize at the Lodge's festive board. Of course, as we move through this drawn-out procedure, we may lose touch with the impatient applicants. They might grow bored. Technology can surely speed up this procedure, especially if we have a high-calibre and serious applicant.

I'll wrap up my address by saying that Freemasonry can use several tactics, beside the ones already elucidated, to both attract new members and keep the ones it already has.

These consist of:

Utilize different channels, including social media, email, and events, to market the organization and its advantages to prospective members.

Encourage current members to introduce the organization to their personal and professional networks by networking with them.

Participate in neighbourhood events and organizations to raise our profile and draw in new members.

Engagement of members: Provide opportunities for members to interact with one another through social occasions, volunteer opportunities, and team-building exercises.

Professional advancement: Provide members with opportunity to grow their professions and pick up new skills through networking and training activities.

Increase diversity in our organization by actively recruiting members from underrepresented groups. This is very important for South Africa with multi-racial groups.

Ensure members believe their membership is valuable and that they are receiving something out of it by providing value.

Clear communication: Inform members of the organization's activities and ways they can participate.

Recognize contributions: Honour members' accomplishments and acknowledge their contributions.

Develop and implement strong mentoring programmes and masonic education. However, bear in mind that not all prospective mentees have the desire to be mentored. Some joined us for the wrong reasons.

Clearly communicate that not everyone must be good in masonic ritual workings, to reduce undue pressure on those who are not able to memorise long ritual pieces / works. Ritual works is one facet of Freemasonry. Members can excel in the other facets.

Revert to decentralised decision making (empowerment). Allow Lodges to make operational decisions.

Last, but not least, review and enhance constantly: Keep an eye out for ways to make the membership experience better.

As Grand Lodge of South Africa, we have been implementing most of these tactics. We may only need to intensify efforts to ensure that our masonic heritage does not suffer much loss in our own generation. By doing so, we can determine its direction.

May The Great Architect of the Universe be with us all. SMIB.

WORLD CONFERENCE OF REGULAR MASONIC GRAND LODGES. FOZ CO IGUACA – PARANA, BRAZIL.

The Grand Lodge of South Africa attended the XIX (nineteenth) World Conference with a delegation led by the Grand Master, MW Bro Godfrey Place, accompanied by a delegation comprising the Grand Chancellor, MW Bro John Smith OSM MSA, Grand Master of Ceremony, VW Bro Achille Katumbay, Wor BB Max Matjane, Sunday Ogunronbi and Bro Thulani Nugubane.

The host Grand Lodge paid special attention to the meeting and greeting of delegates at the Iguazu Falls airport, sometimes at 02h00 and ensured that they were transported safely to their hotel. The registration of the delegates and their partners was equally well organised and the welcome cocktail party on the first night was well attended and much enjoyed. We will however ensure that the welcoming address by

the Grand Master at the XX (twentieth) World Conference in Cape Town is short and interesting.

The main theme of the conference was “Freemasonry as a means to a purposeful life”. It focussed how the world has rapidly changed over the period from around 1950 until 2024 and then forecast what it may look like in 25 years from now. These factors are all relevant in how the world and all of us who live in it experience life. From a world where in 1950, roughly 70% of the population lived in rural settings and 30% were found in cities, it is forecast that in 2050 the complete reversal will have occurred with 70% living in the cities and only 30% living in rural areas. Rapid urbanisation has played havoc with the basic core principles which used to exist, namely strong religious communities, respect, rule of law and tight knit local communities are now seemingly non-existent. People are living far more isolated lives, being isolated in their daily lives and with work habits having undergone massive readjustment due to the Covid pandemic, society suffers from seemingly irreparable fragmentation.

The style of the conference departed from the usual style where individuals presented papers on topics aligned to the conference theme. This conference was a hands on interactive one where delegations were split up into pre-determined groups. The main advantage of this soon became apparent as the debates showed that Masonic traditions and practices differ quite significantly on the various Continents. After watching a short, prerecorded presentation on a particular theme or sub-theme, each group was given 5 questions addressing aspects of the sub-theme to debate and record very simple short answers to these questions. The responses were captured in real time to be collated and summarised, a process which is still being finalised as we wait for the final documents to be released, although a very high-level summary was presented by the hosts at the closing of the conference.

The sub-themes all have relevance in all Grand Lodges and are applicable to our Grand Lodge and our Country.

The Sub-themes which formed the core of the discussions were:

- Freemasonry: Enabler of trust in times of distrust
- Freemasonry: An enabler for deep connections
- Freemasonry: Keeping current generations engaged and attracting future generations

These discussion groups allowed many ideas and challenges to be identified and discussed. It opened a window to view and understand that the challenges faced around the world, although all similar in many aspects, are different due to mainly to culture and practices. An aspect which seemed to run through all groups was the importance of Masonic Education as a means of creating an environment where Brethren derive value from their participation in Freemasonry. It appears that retention rates are higher where education is a formal but fun part of Freemasonry.

The discussion groups were further made up of brethren of varying ages, which provided an opportunity for the younger Brethren (age wise) to share their views. Most interesting was the discussion on the various age groups (Baby Boomers, Gen C, Gen Y and now Gen Z) and how the impact of social media and instant news (including fake news) influences thought patterns and behaviour. It was evident that Freemasonry must adapt to the times to be relevant, without losing sight of its ancient landmarks and traditions.

The “Gen Z” generation for example tend live in a world where they are almost “insular” or “isolated” from the old forms of clubs, societies and other societal organisations. Their reliance on modern technology and means of communication sees them experiencing “friends” on Facebook, but not having close “physical” friends where meaningful relationships are built. They appear to be seeking a “purpose” in life, hence many younger (Gen Z) get involved with global movements which address issues like Global Warming as they believe that society must be protected and we, as the human race, need to

take care of our World to protect it for future generations.

As all these generations could, in some way or another, be potential Freemasons, communication with them was another key aspect which was discussed. It was stressed that communication must not only be focussed with regard to internal communication in the Grand

Lodges, but also with the general public. By so doing the world should be made aware of the relevance of Freemasonry and the good it does in the world.

There was an opportunity for Grand Lodges to exchange gifts and sign treaties of recognition. The issue of treaties of recognition is seemingly important in the South American area, where many South American (Brazilian and Mexican) Grand Lodges were keen to enter into treaties with our Grand Lodge. We had to explain to them the process which we follow for such treaties to be entered into, a process not undertaken lightly and on the spur of the moment. A treaty of recognition was signed with the Symbolic Grand Lodge of Paraguay (following our Grand Lodge process where the Grand Committee had agreed to enter into Amity with them on 20 January 2024). The

signing of this treaty was followed with the exchange of gifts between the Grand Lodges with the added surprise when their Grand Master, MW Bro José Miguel Fernández Zacur, presented their Grand Lodge's highest award to the Grand Master, MW Bro Godfrey Place and to the Grand Chancellor, MW Bro John Smith OSM MSA.

The conference did not only focus on work and the delegates and their partners were taken with luxury buses to the Iguazu Falls, which are spectacular and where they spent a few hours viewing the falls, relaxing in an informal setting and enjoying delicious snacks and liquid refreshments with each other. While the delegates attended the General Meeting, their partners were entertained separately with a delightful river cruise where they enjoyed samba music, delicious snacks and liquid refreshments. The partners were also entertained separately with interesting talks on subjects specially attuned to the interests of the fairer sex.

The conference closed off with a formal gala banquet and dance, where guests were afforded the opportunity to share and experience some of the famous Brazilian traditions and dances (dance competition).









**Annual report of the Provincial Grand Master.
Masonic year 2023/2024. Southern Division.**

Most Worshipful Grand Master, Most Worshipful Past Grand Masters, Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Benin, Right Worshipful, Very Worshipful, Worshipful Brethren, and Brethren all;

It gives me great pleasure to present my Annual Report for the 2023/2024 Masonic year. In July 2023, the Provincial Grand Management Committee of the Southern Division adopted a document which carried its vision and was intended to serve as the blueprint for its activities for the ensuing year.

This document, entitled: **“The Professionalization of the Provincial Grand Lodge”** advocates for and mapped a strategy for a move towards a more visible, efficient and compliant Provincial structure.

The Provincial Grand Lodge was faced with

three major challenges, namely:

- 1) The acute shortage of PGL Officers which resulted in low visibility at lodge level and sub-standard performances at Installations and other PGL appearances;
- 2) The slow and sometimes inadequate supporting of Lodges by PGL through its Commissioned Officers;
- 3) The approval and installation by PGL of Presiding Masters with insufficient Masonic and leadership experience who then struggled to lead and grow their Lodges – eventually resulting in the low quality of PGL Officers.

To address these challenges, the Management Committee successfully implemented three key recommendations being:

1) The mobilization and revitalization of the PGL team – **This resulted in the PGL team growing from 15 Officers in the previous year to 27 active Officers in the current year.** This is a huge win for the Southern Division.

2) The repositioning of the Provincial Grand Executive ommittee. **This saw Commissioned Officers taking charge of Key Performance Areas with set KPIs** as against looking after Lodges and duplicating duties and roles. This approach has also proved to be a success with renewed energy at EXCO level.

3) The setting and enforcing a minimum standard of excellence, qualifying a Brother for election as Presiding Master of a Lodge – As a result of this, **the Division has in the last year witnessed the emergence of a new and vibrant generation of first time Presiding Masters** with 5 of our 8 Lodges electing first time Presiding Masters.

MW Grand Master and Brethren, I am pleased to report that the Southern Division PGL team has achieved the turnaround goal which it set for itself. I am privileged to witness and be part of the renewed energy, zeal and devotion which the PGL team displays. I have no doubt that the unity and drive of the PGL team is a spark which will redirect our Division to its path of growth.

Lodge health and Membership.

During the period under review, all the Lodges in the Southern Division have continued with the standard practice of Freemasonry. All Lodges conduct the required ceremonial workings and business meetings, with dispensation sought and granted for any justifiable deviations.

With the cooperation and support of PGL, all Lodges in the Division have now returned to the set installation dates as prescribed in the bylaws of the various Lodges.

While most of our Lodges remain stable and on a positive growth trajectory, Lodge Marina and Lodge Hiram have displayed commendable turnaround and growth, with the Brethren of

both Lodges promoting friendship and social interaction outside the Lodge room. Lodge de Goede Verwachting has taken a turn for the better. Lodge de Goede Trouw and Losie Jacob de Mist are stable Lodges which are set to grow. Lodge Westerford continues to excel with one of its claims to fame being its vibrant social nature. Lodge de Goede Hoop has maintained its high ritual standards and recorded a growth in its numbers.

According to the figures released by the Grand Secretary, the membership of the Southern Division has grown by 10% in the last year.

It is an undeniable truth that the members of our Lodges now live in a world which presents countless challenges, distractions, pressures and demands. The time, availability and resources of our Brethren are constrained.

These challenges notwithstanding, I am pleased to report that the Southern Division has now stopped the disturbing pattern of Lodge closures which had befallen us in recent years. In this regard, credit must be given to the members and Officers of the various Lodges who have continued to labour for the growth of their respective Lodges.

Benevolence, fundraising and Social activities.

The Southern Division is proud of and supports the Feeding Scheme run by Wor Bro Gary Hendricks and Bro Dennis Knight of Lodge Perseverance and Marina, respectively. Gary and Dennis, assisted by their families feed over 350 residents of the Mitchells Plain community on a weekly basis. Sincere thanks must be extended to Gary, Dennis and their families and to all the Lodges and Brethren who support this lofty initiative.

Wor Bro Marco Petronio, his family and a team of friends have championed the marshalling for the Cape Town Marathon and the Cape Town Cycle Tour. This has become a significant fundraiser in the Division registering in excess of R40 000 towards our PGL Benevolent Fund. Marco – to you, Candice and your girls, we say thank you.

The Lodge de Goede Hoop Masonic Movie Club which was started this year has gained momentum and is now a well enjoyed event in the calendar of the Southern Division. Not only is this an enjoyable social event, it is a Masonic learning experience as well.

The Christmas in July lunch was organised by Lodge Westerford and supported by the Brethren of the Division who sponsored residents of our Masonic Homes to a well enjoyed celebration. Lodge Westerford has earned itself the reputation of a Lodge which takes socials and fundraising seriously. Well done to the Worshipful Master and Brethren of Lodge Westerford.

Lodge Marina and Lodge Perseverance hosted a successful and fun quiz night which was enjoyed by over 40 Brethren and their families.

MW Grand Master and Brethren, although we can never do enough, the SD has had a busy year with regards to benevolence and charity. Going by the number of social events, we have also had a good time this year.

2023 Masonic Olympics.

The Southern Division representing the GLSA took active part in the Masonic Olympics this year and at the close of the games took the 1st Prize in 3 of the disciplines, namely: Trivia; Pool and Shooting. Well done to all the Brethren who participated and I encourage more Brethren to take part in the coming years.

Masonic Homes.

The Masonic Homes are a proud initiative of the Southern Division and supported by all Freemasons in South Africa across all Constitutions.

Four of our 5 homes are doing well with the residents enjoying their time in the Homes. The Masonic Homes for Quadriplegics has been experiencing some challenges with most residents finding it hard to sustain themselves

and the home. An appeal was sent out and the response from the Masonic Community was overwhelming. Thank you to all the Brethren and Lodges who came to the support of the Quad Home.

I would like to express sincere appreciation the Directors of Masonic Homes NPC, its Chairman – Wor Bro Michael Burchell and all the house committee members for their commitment to the maintenance and upkeep of our Homes.

The Masonic Homes is an incredible legacy which we should all protect, preserve and cherish.

Masonic activity and new initiatives.

Masters and Wardens Meeting.

I am pleased to report that the Division has reinstated the annual Masters and Wardens meeting. On Saturday 25th November 2023, all Lodges were represented at an interactive and productive Masters and Wardens Meeting.

Apprentices and Fellowcraft Workshops.

On a monthly basis, the Provincial Grand Master and the Assistant Provincial Grand Masters meets with all the Apprentices and Fellowcrafts of the Division for a workshop/discussion on any selected Masonic topic of interest or importance. These workshops have all been well attended and the discussions have been fruitful with much positive feedback from the Brethren.

I must commend the Presiding Master of Lodge de Goede Hoop, Wor Bro Bradley Bordiss for carrying on with the initiative of meeting with the Apprentices and Fellowcrafts with the sole purpose of Masonic Education (and a glass or two of whiskey after the sessions).

Lodge Visit Tracker.

The Provincial Grand Lodge has commissioned and approved the design of an app to record, track and analyse the data related to Lodge

visits by Brethren. With this app, a Brother simply scans a provide QR Code and his information is synchronized and recorded reflecting the meeting he is attending or visiting. This app will also record the charges which Brethren deliver at a working and serve as a database to be used by Lodge Preceptors when allocating roles or when a Lodge requires assistance. Bro Femi Baiyewu of Lodge de Goede Hoop has been instrumental in the design and creation of this app. Thanks Femi.

Finances.

The Province's finances remain a stable position, much improved from the position we were at the beginning of the year. This item will be covered in more detail by the Provincial Grand Treasurer's Report.

2024 Masonic Ball.

This year is a special year for the Southern Division as the Spring Ball Magazine reaches its 50th Anniversary. This is a phenomenal achievement which every member of this Division should be proud of. I will like to take this opportunity to thank all the Brethren who have contributed to this huge success. I will like to single out MW Bro Geoff Edwards OSM who has produced the Spring Ball Magazine for 25 of the 50 years of its existence. Congratulations Geoff and thank you for your dedication and service to the Southern Division.

I must express my sincere gratitude to the Chairman of the Spring Ball Committee, the Assistant Provincial Grand Master, Wor Bro Marco Petronio, his family and the rest of the Spring Ball Committee.



Annual report of the Provincial Grand Master. Masonic year 2023/2024. Northern Division.

The Grand Master, Most Worshipful Brother Godfrey Stuart Place, Most Worshipful Past Grand Masters, Geoff Edwards OSM, Dave Duncan OSM and John Smith OSM MSA, the Deputy Grand Master, Assistant Grand Masters and Grand Lodge officers, Distinguished Brethren from our sister Constitutions; RW, VW, Wor Bb and Brethren all, it gives me great pleasure to present my Annual Report for the 2023/2024 year.

Little did I realise this time last year, when I delivered an overly positive report that I, and the Provincial Grand Lodge, would face and overcome numerous challenges in the coming year. On a personal note, the year would start with the passing of my Brother Paul to the Eternal East just two weeks after our AGM, followed by some challenging health issues, and just when I started to think the GAOTU was punishing me for being too cocky in my previous report, I was blessed to marry Jané in March.

As a Division, we faced the closure of Lodge Vereeniging due to a lack of local support after a short lived revival; some unfortunate conflict arose between senior brethren and between two of our Lodges; we lost a large number of brethren due to exclusion for non-payment of fees at the end of 2023; and while all of this was happening, faced the challenges of adapting to the change of Leadership in Grand Lodge.

Change is never easy, but when coupled with these other challenges, may at times easily seem more daunting than it actually is.

The pervading lacklustre and despondent attitude of our countrymen in reaction to the socio-economic situation in the country, and with load shedding, crime, corruption and all of the skulduggery that elections seem to encourage being the order of the day, has of course at times affected many of our Brethren, and added to our challenges as leaders. The

same lacklustre attitude has unfortunately pervaded some of their Masonic activities.

But after all is said and done, as Masonic leaders, we have a duty to the Great Architect of the Universe, to the Grand Lodge, to our Brethren and to society at large to face these challenges with courage and determination.

In this regard, I am reminded of the quote from Douglas MacArthur, that famous World War Two military leader and Freemason: "A true leader has the confidence to stand alone, the courage to make tough decisions and the compassion to listen to others". I hope that through the previous year's challenges, I have been able to stand by these words. If at times I appear to have faltered in the previous year: rest assured that my determination to fulfil my obligations remains absolute.

Much has happened this year to give cause for deep contemplation and remind ourselves of the importance of endeavouring to apply the lessons of our Ancient and Honourable Order to both our personal lives, and to our roles as leaders on a daily basis.

We are hopeful that the socio-economic circumstances and of course attitude of all concerned will improve now that the elections are behind us and the Government can get down to the business of serving the electorate.

As mentioned, we lost three Brethren who passed to the Eternal East this past year. The first much closer to home than comfortable, another was an institution in our Order and the third too young to die, but all of them were a sad Loss. We will pay our respects to them during the AGM in the traditional fashion.

The large number of exclusions due to non-payment of fees, the three aforementioned Brethren who passed to the Eternal East and some resignations resulted in the calendar year ending with a net loss in membership of 36. Thankfully we have been able to initiate 24

members since January to make up these losses and have a fair number of Candidates in process. We remain determined to complete this calendar year reflecting a net growth in spite of those earlier losses. Clearly, we do not have challenges recruiting members; our challenge lies in retaining the interest of our Master Masons sufficiently for them to prioritise remaining members and the payment of their fees.

Challenges around the collection of capitation fees continued, and it is imperative that Lodge Leadership, in particular Presiding Masters and Treasurers, take up the responsibility of ensuring membership and capitation fees are timeously collected from members and paid to Provincial Grand Lodge promptly. While this has now been resolved and I am pleased to report we have settled our obligations to Grand Lodge, we must remain vigilant in this regard.

As always, there are those Lodges which seemed to be better equipped to rise above the challenges facing them during the previous year, and I can only put this down to the Lodge leadership.

Lodge Alpha, Koh-I-Noor, MW Pretorius, President Burgers, Prins Frederik, Star of the East, Star of the Rand and Trichardt have all shown growth since January and in particular, Lodge MW Pretorius with a growth of four members; and Lodge Trichardt with a growth of six, are examples of what can be achieved with enthusiastic leadership. It is noteworthy that the growth in Lodge Trichardt was driven by the then Lodge Secretary who at the time was Presiding Master of Lodge Star of the East, which also grew by three members. It can and has been done Brethren, and we need to collectively focus on the positive actions that make that growth possible.

Not surprisingly, our strategies for the coming years remain sustainable growth across a wider base of our Lodges, and a renewed focus on retention.

The satisfaction survey conducted in June had an outstanding response rate of 30% and gave some truly insightful feedback. Our Brethren

who are properly mentored strongly believe that they receive better value for money, have a better overall experience and meet their expectations on joining the Order far more than those who are not mentored. A number of tactics around the improvement of our mentoring will therefore be introduced and monitored this year.

I would like to once again make use of this opportunity to thank all of the members of the PGL ND EXCO for their contributions this past year for which I am eternally grateful. While we all know there is always room for improvement, I am mindful of the fact that you are all volunteers who take time out of their busy lives to serve our order.

I would also like to thank all of the Provincial Grand Lodge Officers for their dedication and commitment, we have once again driven many kilometres to fulfil our duties, all without complaint. Some of you have taken office at short notice to assist where others have been unable, rest assured these efforts do not go unnoticed.

The Travelling Gavel trophy, currently held by Lodge Alpha, has continued to play a role in increasing visiting between Lodges, with numbers in excess of 40 at a ceremonial working not being unusual.

Once again however, the enthusiasm of our senior Brethren and their commitment to visiting other Lodges has continued to play a role in this increased activity and I value their commitment and enthusiasm.

The Division and Lodges again supported a number of charitable causes in the past year, from the Grand Master's cookie challenge for Christmas which had 400 kgs of cookies donated by the Lodges and distributed to those in need to brighten their Christmas, to the many donations made in respect of blankets for indigent as well as for animals and other local causes. The Burns night banquet to be held after the AGM will raise funds in aid of ADASA, the Alzheimer's and Dementia Association for South Africa, a worthy cause which focusses on providing support and assistance for a terrible disease

which can at times be neglected by society. As you all know, our Grandmaster has pledged his support for this worthy cause during his term.

Studies have estimated that Dementia affects between 3.8% and 11% of adults aged 60 and older, the effects of which can be debilitating. Alzheimer's represents between 60 and 70% of Dementia cases. Age, obesity, physical inactivity and high blood pressure are amongst the modifiable risk factors for developing dementia.

Freemasonry is, and should remain a rewarding, meaningful and fun activity for our Members and our positive use of the Balanced Lodge Program should be an effective measure of how well we are succeeding in this regard. Unfortunately, many Lodges do not participate by completing the simple scorecard.

I have already thanked my EXCO and PGL ND Officers and congratulated those Lodges who have achieved remarkable growth. In addition, I would offer my gratitude as follows:

Firstly, to the GAOTU without whose grace this past year may not have been bearable, we will continue to labour in your name and to your honour and glory.

To PGL ND officers who have agreed to take up office for the coming year, thank you for your willingness to serve and remember, that is our role, to serve the Lodges and brethren in the Northern Division with diligence and humility.

To the winners of the various awards which will be made at the AGM, I will not mention your names here because this report will be distributed beforehand, in certain cases, the decision on who should win the award was relatively easy. In others it was exceptionally hard, with so many deserving nominees to consider. Just know that your award is both recognition and thanks from a grateful Provincial Grand Lodge EXCO who all appreciate your contribution to our collective success.

To Wor Bro Maxwell Matjane, who has resigned from his role as Assistant Provincial Grand Master in order to pursue his other interests in Freemasonry, I thank you for your service and wish you success and happiness in your ongoing Masonic career.

To every Lodge Master, Officer and member who once again gave up their time to make themselves better men and the world a better place, thank you, without you and your efforts we would have no purpose.

To the senior members of the Grand Lodge within the division who gave my team and I their unstinting support in all our endeavours, we trust that your faith in us has been rewarded.

To the Grandmaster, MW Bro Godfrey Place, thank you for your willingness to engage and offer support; this past year has been a challenging one and has required that we all dig deeply.

To my fellow Provincial Grand Masters in the Sister Divisions, I thank you for your friendship, guidance and fellowship, we have started to work well together as a team and will often be a source of guidance to each other when resolving common challenges.


To the Heads of our Sister Constitutions, I am once again impressed by your willingness to work together in the best interests of Freemasonry - I will say more about this at the AGM.





**Annual report of the Provincial Grand Master.
Masonic year 2023/2024. Central Division.**

Hoog Eerwaarde, Seer Verligte, Seer Agbare, Agbare broers en broers almal:

Sedert Julie 2023 het ek die voorreg gehad om hierdie provinsie te lei en te bestuur as Waarnemende PGM. Dankie vir hierdie voorreg.

Tvdens hierdie tydperk het ek die volgende strategie gevole nl:

1. Vrymesselary is uit eie vrye wil en nie verpligtend nie, dus moet dit lekker wees en elke lid moet geestelik en morele groei ervaar. Hierdie kwaliteit produk sal alle ander beproewinge oorskadu.

2, Konsentreer op eenvoudige moreel etiese waades. Betrek die gesinne en families van lede.

Hierdie skep n gevoel van heilsaamheid en al die bestaande losies wat hierdie resepe volg, is gesond en gebalanseerd.

3. Sorg dat n bestuurs stvl van nederigheid gehandhaaf word deur die provinsie. Deur dit te doen skep jy n bestuurstyl waar elke lid die vrymoedigheid het, om insette te mag lewer en ook aktief betrokke te wees. In wese kry elke lid eienaarskap van die organisasie en word elke lid betrek om meelewend in alle beplanning en aktiwiteite te wees.

Ek is vas oortuig dat die Sentrale afdeling steeds lewens vatbaar is, en “n bestaansreg het. Met hierdie in gedagte moet ons besef dat hierdie voortbestaan egter af hang van, gesonde en deursigtige bestuurspraktyke. Tans is baie van die lede apaties teenoor die provinsiale grootlosie. Ons beskik egter oor baie innoverende en talentvolle lede, wat besig is om tot hul reg te kom, nadat hul betrek is in deel gemaak is van n funksionele bestuursplan.

Ledetal en losies.

Ledetal, was nog altyd, en sal ook altyd n probleem bly. Dit kan egter bestuur word om nie ‘n probleem te wees nie. Hoe meer funksionele losies ons het in die provinsie hoe groter word ons "footprint" en maak lidmaatskap meer gerieflik en toeganklik. Ons het ondervind hoe meer lede aktief is in hul onderskeie gemeenskappe hoe meer aanvaarbaar raak vrymesselary.

Soos in die verlede het ons n teiken getal van 3 nuwe lede per losie per jaar, hierdie teiken het losies gemotiveer en in die losies waar dit aangedryf is, is dit suksesvol. Dus indien dit weer positief geïnisieer word, sal dit verdere resultate afwerp.

Die Sentrale afdeling bestaan steeds uit nege (9) losies met gesamentlike ledetal wat gegroei het van 73 na 82 lede, hierdie ledetal word opgemaak deur 64 werklike lede en 18 dupliserende lede. Volgens my beskeie mening is ‘n gesonde syfer vir hierdie afdeling ongeveer 100 na 105 lede vir die getal losies, Met inagnome dat die oorgrote meerderheid van die dupliserende lede hul bevind in twee losies nl: Losie Diamond en Losie Magersfontein. Saamtrek van die hele provinsie se losie lede was gehou op naweek van 6 tot 9 November 2023 te Aldam Oord geleë te Ventersburg.

Dit is gedoen om weer die die samehorigheid en broederskap te hervestig en te versterk in die provinsie. Tydens hierdie naweek is vergadering gehou met al die broers van die verskillende losies om die pad vorentoe te bespreek en ook hul sieninge en menings te hoor. Die fondasie vir ons provinsie se toekoms is gelê en ons kan nou met vertroue bou aan ons

ledetal. Alhoewel ons die afgelope kwartaal gegroei het, moet ons steeds met n groot getal lede groei om werklik funksioneel en doelgerig te kan arbeid.

Die toekoms lyk rooskleurig en ons is vol vertroue om ons doelwit van 3 lede per losie te bereik in die komende jaar.

Losie Central Free State (Welkom).

11 meesters/ 2 geselle en 2 Leerlinge (teiken getal van 3 is wel bereik en oorskry)
Die losie is steeds baie aktief en gemotiveerd. Vanaf Julie 2023 het hul twee eerste graad werkings gedoen. Ek het persoonlik die werking in Nov bygewoon met ‘n amptelik afvaardiging vanaf losie Senekal. Twee van De Morgenster se lede is onder my aandrang oorgeplaas na hierdie losie aangesien dit meer prakties en haalbaar is. Hul het n verdere 2 kanidate in die nabye toekoms in die pyplyn. Die losie is stabiel en gefokus.

Losie Dasbreek (Bloemfontein).

7 meesters / 4 leerlinge / L kanidate (teiken getal van 3 is bereik en oorskry)
Die losie is onder leiding van Agbare Broer John Meyer as meester en S.V. Br Frans Appelgryn as sekretaris. Die Losie is steeds baie aktief en besoek ander losies op n gereelde basis. Hul het ‘n derde graad werking op 8 Jan 2024 vir Br Eon Kruger gehad. Hul is op datum met al hul finansiële asook administratiewe verpligtinge. Agbare broer John Meyer het ook gedurende laat November en Desember n besoek aan India gedoen, waar hy verskeie losies besoek het.

Gedurende die eerste week van Desember het die losie ook Finansiële hulp verleen aan n behoevende huisgesin wat hul huis in n brand verloor het. Die betrokke losie se ritueel werk is steeds van puik gehalte en standaard is baie goed.

Losie Unie (Bloemfontein).

11 meesters/
Hierdie losie word goed bestuur onder leiding van Agb Br Riaan Croucamp en sekretaris Agb Broer John Meyer. Hul besoek gereeld die

ander losies in Bloemfontein, maar reis min na ander verder geleë losies. Die losie is ook in goeie harmonie en stabiel met min onstuimigheid. Hul is op datum met al hul finansiële asook administratiewe verpligtinge.

Peace & Harmony (Kimberley).

14 meesters/2 kanidate (werk aan doelstelling) Behalwe vir een bedanking (verhuis na kinders in JHB.) is die status quo redelik dieselfde. Hul was ook baie betrokke en aktief by die bevestiging van SV Br Peet Louw se installasie as Distriks Grootmeester van afdeling Vrystaat sentraal. Hul is gemotiveerd en het verskeie planne om bykomende lede te werf, Agb Br Francois Dauth is tans voorsittende Meester en Agbare Br Mike Combrink sekretaris.

Een van hul lede het meer as 25 jaar diens. Die ander lede is betreklik jonk met minder as 6 jaar diens. Hul is op datum met al hul finansiële asook administratiewe verpligtinge. Die lede van hierdie losie laat hul nie afskrik van afstande nie en ry geweldig rond vir besoeke. Hul is aktief en word goed bygewoon deur lede van die susters konstitusies. Hierdie losie se gebou is seker die beste versorgde losie in die Sentrale afdeling. Die broers word ook baie goed deur hul onderskeie families ondersteun.

De Morgenster (Kroonstad).

6 meesters (2 werklike huis losie en 4 Dupliserende lede) daar is ongeveer 3 potensiële lede.

Die huidige Meester is Agb Br John Kriel en sekretaris word tans hanteer deur Agb Br Johnny Cambanis. Hierdie losie is vanjaar prioriteit om gehervestig te word in nuwe gebou in Kroonstad. My beweegrede hiervoor is omrede Kroonstad die tweede grootste stad in die sentrale afdeling is met n geraamde bevolking van ongeveer 600 000 inwoners. Dis is daar baie potensiaal en as vrymesselary moet ons poog om ons voetspoor daar te behou.

Hierdie losie is steeds in "limbo" weens die feit dat hul losie gebou verkoop is en het hul tans nie n amptelike gebou nie. Huidiglik hou hul maandeliks in Losie Central Free State se gebou vergadering wat dit problematies maak. Die Meester se gesondheid laat hom in die steek

deurdat sy oë drasties verswak en hy nie in die aand kan bestuur nie.

Senekal.

8 meesters/ 2 Gesele/ 1 leerling/ 3 kanidate en oud lid vir heraansluiting (reeds doelwit bereik).

Gedurende hierdie termyn is SV. Br Alf Bronner bevestig as voorsittende meester en Br Andries Prinsloo as Sekretaris te Aldam Oord, te Ventersburg. Hierdie losie het n amptelike besoek gebring aan Losie CFS en is baie aktief en besoek deurlopend al die ander losies in die Sentrale afdeling. Daar is verskeie potensiële lede wat klop en ons ons voorsien om met ongeveer 4 nuwe lede te groei in die nuwe jaar. Hul jaarlikse kersfunksie vir minder bevoorregtes te Senekal op 2 Desember 2023 was n groot sukses en is goed teenwoordig deur verskeie losies asook publiek. Die losie se finansies is gesond.

Parys.

Annual report of the Provincial Grand Master. Masonic year 2023/2024. Eastern Division.

Most Worshipful Brethren, Right Worshipful Brethren, Very Worshipful Brethren, Worshipful Brethren and Brethren:

I welcome you to our 47th Annual General Meeting. I sincerely appreciate every Brother here today who took the time from their busy schedule to join us in celebrating another Annual General Meeting. It may sound strange to state that we are celebrating another AGM but just as we have to be grateful for another day of being alive every morning we wake up, as Masons we need to be grateful for another year of surviving as a Division, despite the serious challenges of diminishing membership. General:

In a recent conversation with the MW Grand Master, he advised me not to try and patch up cracks with paper; any report such as this one should be brutally honest and point out the challenges and problems facing the Eastern Division. It is not all doom and gloom and there are indications of light at the end of the tunnel, but we must make very sure that the light approaching us in that tunnel is not a freight train. We must properly formulate our vision for the future and work at it every single day.

Membership.

Due to a variety of factors, our membership has further declined to a total of 36 members. We have to balance our recruitment efforts with the proper preparation of existing lodge members to be able and qualified to receive and initiate new candidates and mentor them to such an extent that they will be retained as members for many years to come.

Vague and general statements regarding recruitment and retention are not going to get the job done. We must be very specific, realistic and committed to our vision and the practical steps we are going to take to achieve it.

Firstly, we will stabilise our lodges by making them happy places again. Social gatherings and improved ritual work will be the foundation of

this process. Low attendance at lodge meetings is a sure indication that brethren are not enjoying coming to meetings, and I am very sure that the lack of social activities contributed to this situation. Members cannot be forced to be sociable, but as soon as opportunities are created for these social activities, the ball starts rolling again. The Ritual Excellence program has been neglected badly and will be revived to ensure improvement in ritual work.

As requested by the Grand Master, efforts have been made to contact members who resigned in the past few years, both in Durban and Pietermaritzburg. We have already had a measure of success in talking to these brethren about returning to the Craft, but time will tell.

Lodges of the Eastern Division.

Lodge First United has unfortunately had a steep decline in membership over the past year. It was partly due to members relocating, but it was also due to friction between senior members of the lodge which has since been resolved to a large degree. The WM, Wor Bro Henry Selzer, has a firm grip on the efforts to rebuild the lodge and two new candidates were initiated in 2024 already.

As with all other Eastern Division lodges, one of the main challenges is the financial hardship and work commitments of the members. Financial hardship does not only result in issues regarding payment of subscriptions, but it also leads to limited availability of brethren to attend regular meetings as they must work more than one job to make ends meet. Brethren who were very committed and regularly attended meetings in the past, are unable to do so now until their financial circumstances improve.

The quality of the new initiates is very encouraging, and it bodes well for Lodge First United.

Lodge Neerlandia initiated one candidate and welcomed four new members from Lodges **Dromedaris** and **Theophilus** which had to close. The strong point of the lodge is that it has a lot of senior and experienced brethren,

such as the PGM, DPGM, APMG and PG Secretary. Unfortunately, this also poses a problem as these brethren are not available to the lodge when there is an installation of its lodge or another Eastern Division lodge. It does, however, put the lodge in a position to initiate and mentor a substantial number of new candidates, when the social media campaign starts showing positive results.

Lodge Meerensee was the fastest-growing lodge in the Division and had the stability of very experienced Brethren to ensure that the new members would be properly mentored and retained for the lodge and the Division. Unfortunately, the lodge also experienced some friction between senior members of the lodge and is currently attempting to restore the peace, love and harmony that can see the lodge grow well again in future. WB Marais Viljoen who is also very active in the English Constitution, has been installed as Presiding Master for another year and he has the attributes to overcome the current challenges in the lodge. Younger brethren are coming through to take office in the lodge, but it will still require a serious effort to ensure that membership does not decline any further.

Commissioned Officers.

The Eastern Division has continuity regarding Commissioned Officers, with Wor Bro Ike Ezeudji remaining as DPGM and Wor Bro Henry Selzer as APMG. My thanks to them for supporting and assisting me through the past Masonic year.

Provincial Grand Officers.

As a large percentage of members who resigned over the past 2 years were senior brethren, we are experiencing a serious shortage of PG officers.

Apart from the Commissioned Officers, I only have 7 PG officers available to me. Three of them are primarily English Masons, which creates a challenge not only when they must give preference to the English Constitution meetings, but also prevents them from being promoted to a rank in the PGL Eastern Division that is higher than their rank in the English District.

This problem can only be overcome by returning senior brethren who resigned, or over time as keen and able younger brethren progress through the ranks. It was very heartening for me recently to have a newly raised Master Mason come up to me after an installation to enquire about how he could go about becoming a PG officer. This is the attitude we need in our division.

Sister Divisions.

Testament to the resurgence and new energy in the Grand Lodge is the fact that I went from Rookie PGM to senior PGM in the last 2 years. There has always been a very tight comradery amongst PGMs, but the young group of PGMs we have currently have a special bond as we are all from the same Grand Lodge era and experience level.

A special thanks to my fellow PGMs who are always available for advice or just a brotherly chat and some good humour.

Sister Constitutions.

We are lucky to have very strong relationships between the Sister Constitutions in KwaZulu-Natal (KZN).

The quarterly Inter Constitutional Chains meetings still serve the very important purpose of coordinating Masonic activities in the province. The Masonic "What's on" WhatsApp group and combined KZN Masonic calendar make life a lot easier and mostly prevent duplication of meeting dates across the different Constitutions in KZN.

Benevolence.

The Division continues to assist **The Elders' Voice** organisation for destitute elderly people. This organisation was the recipient of over 100 kg of biscuits distributed as part of the Grand Master's initiative towards the end of 2023.

They also received chocolates to the value of R7500 donated by a company named Diplomat. A bar of chocolate may seem like an everyday snack to us, but to most of the old people, it is a highlight of their month or even year.

KZN Care Association was the charity chosen to receive 100 teddy bears for their dementia patients as part of the Grand Lodge Dementia Association project. We received good exposure for the Grand Lodge and Freemasonry in general when an article on this project was published in the Berea Mail.

Finances.

The Eastern Division’s finances are stable and sufficient for our level of needs.

The investments of the Barry Brecher Fund and the PGL Benevolent Fund are performing well despite challenging investment markets. These funds are at the highest level it has been in many years and will be utilised with circumspection to achieve our financial goals.

AASR and RA.

It is a major concern that the Royal Arch is not

functional at all in KZN, and the AASR has started meetings again but is also not active enough. This is mainly because the Craft has low numbers which results in a much lower potential for new members coming through.

In Conclusion.

The Eastern Division is not where it should be in terms of membership and we have experienced serious challenges regarding commitment and meeting attendance, but there are still enough brethren with the will and drive to turn this situation around. We just need proper coordination of our efforts and more commitment to make it work. We owe it to the young initiates that we brought into the Craft recently, to not only give them a future on the GLSA but also a quality experience.

LOSIE MAKALANI.

The first time Freemasons met in Grootfontein was with the aim of establishing a Lodge. The meeting took place at the Meteor Hotel on 14 March 1971 with 14 Brethren in attendance. Two years passed before the idea once again gained momentum. On 26 May 1973, a meeting was held where twenty-six Brethren were present.

Two Brothers, E. Pote and J. Louw, from Lodge Benguela of the Scottish Constitution, came up specially from Windhoek for this meeting. They addressed the meeting and explained the implications and requirements for the establishment of a new Lodge under the Scottish Constitution. The period mentioned for the founding of a Lodge was very long.

As most of the potential members had closer ties with South Africa than with Scotland, England or Ireland and, as it had already been decided that the medium of communication of the new Lodge would be Afrikaans, the English and Irish Constitutions were not considered. The length of time to obtain a Charter from the Scottish Constitution ruled them out as well.

On 4 June 1973, a name, a coat of arms as well as the colour and shape of the apron, were decided upon. It was also decided that the members would apply to the Grand Lodge of South Africa for a Charter due to its shorter time period to obtain a Charter.

The other Constitutions gave their full cooperation and, in particular, the English Constitution, contributed much to the

establishment of the Lodge. It can be assumed that without their help there would probably never have been a Losie Makalani No. 114 GLSA.

On 12 June 1973, a temporary Charter was received from the Grand Lodge of Southern Africa and the arrangements for a Temple commenced with individuals contributing very generously. Bro. Hans Wilhelm made land available on his smallholding, about 15 kilometres outside Grootfontein on the Rundu road. His wife donated 4,000 bricks. Wor. Bro. Helmuth Kirchner and his wife Kotie designed the Makalani Jewel.

As a sign of Brotherly affection, the D.G.M. of the English Constitution in South-West Africa, RW. Bro. Glen Smith manufactured the chairs including ones for the Master, Wardens, Secretary and Treasurer. Bro. Nico Neethling was in charge of the building operations.

Finally, on 3 November 1973, in a building without a ceiling or floor covering, Losie Makalani was consecrated by the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Southern Africa, MW Bro. Sidney Gasson. The Installation of the Lodge Officers was performed by the Provincial Grand Master of the Southern Division, RW Bro. Morris Levin and his Provincial Grand Lodge Officers.

The Charter Master was Wor Bro L. L. Holmes with 36 Founder members to support him. 10 of the 17 office bearers were members of the Namutoni Lodge, English Constitution, at

Tsumeb.

Since the Temple was located some distance outside Grootfontein and the political conditions in the country did not make it very safe, in 1978 the Brethren decided that permanent accommodation in the town should be looked at.

During this difficult time, the Tyler was armed with a firearm and not just a sword.

Fundraising was started, with the women of the Lodge contributing a lot with their 'Kekkel Klub' (Gaggle Club). In 1982, after 10 years on the small holding the Brethren purchased a house in Grootfontein within the town.

After renovations and changes, the new Masonic Temple was consecrated by the Provincial Grand Master of the Southern Division of the Grand Lodge of South Africa, RW Bro le Roux Hancke on 2 July 1983. It has served as their Temple ever since.

Note: The Grand Lodge of Southern Africa changed to the Grand Lodge of South Africa in 1981.

From the start, Losie Makalani rode on the crest of the wave and in 1981 the first local member

of the Lodge, Wor Bro. André Muller, was installed as Presiding Master.

Truly a success story when one considers that Losie Makalani was able to build two Temples within ten years and that the last one is fully paid for.

Losie Makalani is the only South African Constitution Lodge in Namibia. The Lodge enjoys a special status within the Grand Lodge of South Africa and is very well supported by the South African Brethren every year when the Installation of its Master occurs.

The Lodge celebrated its 50th anniversary on Saturday 19 August 2023. MW Bro Godfrey Place and his Grand Lodge team performed the Rededication ceremony and then RW Bro Alf Brönnner and his team performed the Installation ceremony. The Deputy Grand Master, RW Bro Tommy Hardiman, had conducted a "What is Freemasonry?" working for invited guests earlier in the day.

The evening's banquet was also a great success, and Lodge Makalani took the opportunity to get the Grand Master to hand over a donation of N\$20 000 to the Karl Albrecht Village for the Aged.

RECONSECRATION OF LODGE SPRINGBOK No 87 AS VIRTUAL LODGE.

Lodge Springbok was re-established primarily to provide a home for Brethren of the GLSA who, for various reasons, find themselves outside South Africa but wish to maintain an active relationship with the GLSA and their fellow Brethren. This allows them to enjoy the benefits of GLSA membership, essentially paying dues and receiving value from the association.

To ensure value for money while respecting the Ancient Landmarks of Regular Freemasonry, Lodge Springbok functions as a Lodge of Research. This excludes the practice of rituals and workings typical of a Tiled Lodge.

Its scope of research extends beyond academic study, embracing open thinking, perception-based analyses, and introspective works. The lodge's primary goal is to foster a shared environment for exploring and expanding Masonic thought.

Lodge Springbok had the distinction of being the last lodge to receive a number under the Grand East of the Netherlands banner within South Africa on the 1st January 1960, that of number 228 NC. Its number on the roll of the newly formed Grand Lodge of South Africa in May 1961 was 87 GLSA.

On 4th December 2007, the lodge closed their doors due to a drastic decline in membership. On 7th December, 17 years later, almost to the day, the lodge was happily reconsecrated. This was done virtually as an on-line lodge for Brethren from all across the globe to log in over the internet. The Worshipful Master for the newly reformed lodge is Wor Bro Tony Bosman who is situated in Portugal.

For now, let us return to its beginnings. The Petition to establish the lodge was dated 24th October 1959 and the lodge was consecrated on Saturday 2nd April 1960 in the Masonic Temple situated at 80 Plein Street, Johannesburg, by RW Bro Eddie Conradie, the Provincial Grand Master of the Transvaal Division.

The Charter Master was Wor Bro LE Jackson from Lodge Golden City (no 205 NC now no 75 GLSA). There were 23 other Foundation members who came from the Netherlandic, the English as well as the Scottish Constitutions.

Extracts from the Valedictory Report 1960/61 of the first Worshipful Master of Lodge Springbok makes interesting reading and gives context to the formation of the lodge.

The winds of change had indeed blown down the African Continent, Russia had sent the first satellite to the Planet Venus, South Africa had withdrawn from the Commonwealth and set up a Republic, the Union had changed its monetary system from sterling to decimal coinage, South Africa had experienced for the very first time attempt at assassination, and in the Masonic world the Brethren of the Netherlandic Constitution had formed the Grand Lodge of Southern Africa which is in the process of being consecrated.

When Springbok Lodge was in the process of formation, I personally approached a Senior Provincial Grand Lodge Officer as to the proposed name of "Springbok" for the new lodge. His reply was "Lou, you are sticking out your necks wanting a name like that for a Lodge, you not only have to fulfil the Masonic duties, but you will have to live up to the traditions of the sportsmen of this Country who have all excelled themselves as 'Springbokke'".

A challenge had been given, and like our famous sportsmen we accepted the challenge, and we consecrated a lodge under the name that was, in the space of twelve short months, to rise to such heights that surpassed even the wildest dreams of the Founders.

I am deeply conscious of the honour that I was the first and last Master of Springbok Lodge working under the Grand East of the Netherlands, and I extend my heartfelt thanks to the Brethren of this Lodge, who have demonstrated their confidence in me by electing me not only for a second term of office but by

giving me the honour of now being the first Master working under the Grand Lodge of Southern Africa.

So, Brethren, as the sands of time run out on this our first year, I lay down my gavel under the old rule and soon I will be taking it up under the new regime, the ship moves on, the old order changes, but for Springbok Lodge the Light of Freemasonry is in the East, our efforts are undiminished and unimpaired.

Although Wor Bro Jackson was installed in April for a second term, it was not to be. Sadly, he passed away two weeks later, and the Deputy Master Wor Bro IJ Cohen completed the year as Acting Worshipful Master.

As with the banner, the lodge's apron bears the GLSA lodge number, so what their apron looked like for their first year under the Grand East of the Netherlands is not known. Their colour however did not change as the Petition for a Warrant states that their distinguishing colours were to be Dark Green and Gold. Their apron under the Grand Lodge of South Africa displayed a badge showing their name, number, and the head of a Springbok on the main part of the apron. The apron had a rounded flap of dark green which was edged with gold braiding and a dark gold fringe. The ribbon edging the main part of the apron was also dark green.

The lodge met at the Plein Street Temple for their first year moving to Freemasons Hall in Park Lane in April 1961. Twenty years on, it was unanimously approved to move their meeting place to the then new Orange Grove Masonic Complex.


Springbok Lodge took their responsibilities to heart. In September 1965, after an appeal had gone out for contributions to the Masonic Temple Appeal, their contribution stood at

1550. This Masonic Temple Appeal was raising funds to build a Temple on land adjacent to the present Park Lane Temple in Johannesburg which is owned by the English Constitution.

To put that amount in context, the lodge's annual dues to Province for 34 members was R85. There was a quota amount for each lodge to contribute and should they achieve it, they would be awarded a Builders Jewel to attach to the AJ Haak collarette worn by the IPM's. This was something that Springbok Lodge did achieve, in fact they were the first lodge to achieve this target, and even doubled it.

Forty years on, with declining membership, Lodge Springbok began having joint meetings with Lodge Alpha who also met at the Orange Grove Masonic Complex. After struggling for three years to remain open, the decision was taken to hand in their Charter. A letter to the Provincial Grand Lodge Northern Division gives the details of their final joint meeting to be held on 4 December 2007. The Charter of Lodge Springbok was returned to Grand Lodge and the remaining members officially joined Lodge Alpha.





AWARDS OF EXCELLENCE..

I introduced special Awards of Excellence at my installation three years ago and I have presented several of these awards during my term of office to worthy Companions. RITUAL EXCELLENCE AWARDS.

AWARD FOR THE BEST SCRIBE EZRA OF THE YEAR.

The office of Scribe Ezra at any level of the organisation is often considered a thankless task. Notwithstanding this, we have several Companions who excel in this position and so we re-introduced the Supreme Grand Chapter Award for the Best Scribe Ezra of the Year. This is not only to reward a worthy Companion for the excellent work which he has done in this regard, but rather to encourage all other Companions in the office of Scribe Ezra to improve their standard and emulate his example. This appears to have been an inspiration and we have received several recommendations for this award this year.

FOREIGN RELATIONS.

During the past year we have maintained our fraternal relationship with the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapters with whom we are in amity. I again thank MEC Godfrey Place, our Grand Master, for representing our Supreme Grand Chapter at the installation of the new First Grand Principal of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Benin, MEC Matthieu Lawson, in Benin during May 2024.

During July 2024 we were invited to attend the installation of RW Bro Hilton Oates, a member of our Royal Arch Chapter Johannes Truter, as the new District Grand Master of the English District Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons in the Western Cape. We were honoured to meet and spend some quality time with the Pro – Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of England and Wales, MW Bro John Prizeman, and the senior officers who accompanied him. We gave them a tour of this De Goede Hoop temple and he, in turn, was pleased to receive a copy of the 250 year Heritage Book which I presented to him. I have recently received a note from him that he was finding the history of Freemasonry in South Africa during the past 250 years most interesting and enlightening.

We are also blessed to have MEC Dimitrios Kontesis, a Past First Grand Principal of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Greece as well as a delegation from the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Benin, in attendance today. To you Most Excellent Companions and Excellent Companions, a special word of

welcome and my sincere thanks to you for your attendance here today.

When we celebrated the Golden Jubilee of this Supreme Grand Chapter during 2019 we were honoured by the presence of the First Grand Principal of our Mother Supreme Grand Chapter, being the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of the Netherlands. We have already received a notice of its 75th or Diamond Anniversary, which will take place during June 2025 and we look forward to supporting them in celebrating this very important and prestigious event.

SISTER CONSTITUTIONS.

We are truly blessed to enjoy a very good, healthy and fraternal relationship with the members of our Sister Constitutions in South Africa. This was again exhibited during the past year with regular visits from members of our Sister Constitutions to our regular convocations. We often invite them to participate in our degree workings, which invitations they always readily accept even though our rituals may be slightly different to what they are used to.

I enjoy visiting our Sister Constitutions and every convocation which I attend further enhances my knowledge of Royal Arch Freemasonry, which has often been referred to as the very root and marrow of Freemasonry.

CONCLUSION.

I thank the True and Living God Most High for preserving my health and strength; for keeping us safe; for watching over our welfare and for guiding me in my thoughts, words and actions during my term of office.



THE ABRIDGED HISTORY OF THE SUPREME GRAND ROYAL ARCH CHAPTER OF SOUTH AFRICA.

The Grand Lodge of the Netherlands introduced Freemasonry to South Africa during 1772 with the formation of Lodge De Goede Hoop in Cape Town. This was the first Freemason's Craft Lodge to be established in South Africa and is the oldest operating Lodge in existence in the Southern Hemisphere. During 1811 the first Craft Lodge under the English Constitution was established in South Africa, being the British Lodge in Cape

Town. In 1860 the first Craft Lodge under the Scottish Constitution was established in South Africa, being Lodge Southern Cross in Cape Town. Both these Lodges, as well as many others, owe their formation to the Netherlandic Constitution in South Africa in general and to the members of Lodge De Goede Hoop in particular. The De Goede Hoop temple was constructed during the period 1800 to 1803 and has been the venue for

the celebration of countless Masonic events and the consecration of many Lodges, Chapters and Masonic Orders in South Africa during the past 216 years.

The first Royal Arch Chapter in the Netherlands was formed during 1949, following a request by the Grand Lodge of the Netherlands to the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of England to do so. Notwithstanding this, certain Royal Arch Chapters under the English, the Scottish and the Irish Constitutions already existed in South Africa by such date and many Netherlandic Freemasons were members of these Chapters. During 1950 certain members of Lodge Mutual in Cape Town, which fell under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of the Netherlands, requested the Provincial Grand Lodge of the Southern Division to submit a request to the Grand Lodge of the Netherlands seeking permission to form a Royal Arch Chapter in Cape Town under the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of the Netherlands.

Permission was duly granted during 1951 for the formation of Royal Arch Chapters in South Africa under the newly established Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of the Netherlands. The members of Lodge Mutual thereupon resolved to form Chapter Mutual and proposed three of their members, who had attained the Royal Arch degree in one or more Chapters of the Sister Constitutions, being Worshipful Brothers HL Sumner, FV Ryan and J Dommissie to be the first Most Excellent Zerubbabel, the first Excellent Haggai and the first Excellent Joshua respectively of the new Royal Arch Chapter.

A petition to form Chapter Mutual was duly prepared and signed by RW Bro JG Rose (the Deputy Grand Master National of the Grand Lodge of the Netherlands in South Africa), RW Bro CG Botha (the Provincial Grand Master of the Southern Division) and the Worshipful Brethren TA Murray, P Clouts, HL Sumner, FV Ryan, AS Hooper, FH Kenneth-Watts, LH Croxford, JHS Hofmeyer, SD

Shargey and HW Gibson, who thereupon became the founding members of Chapter Mutual and consequently Royal Arch Freemasonry under this Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter.

As the Netherlandic Royal Arch rituals were still in the process of being translated into English, it was resolved that Chapter Mutual would use the rituals of the Scottish Constitution and the Scottish Royal Arch Chapter Southern Cross readily agreed to lend their regalia, their rituals and all other necessary equipment to Chapter Mutual until it could acquire its own.

On 28 May 1953 Chapter Mutual was duly consecrated in the De Goede Hoop temple and the abovementioned Principals were installed as such. The ceremony of consecration and installation was performed by MEC JG Rose, who also held the rank Deputy First Grand Principal of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of the Netherlands. He was assisted by MEC CG Botha, who also held the rank of Deputy Second Grand Principal and other high ranking Royal Arch Freemasons from the English and the Scottish Constitutions. Chapter Mutual thereafter commenced working in the Suburban temple in Rondebosch.

Shortly thereafter and also during 1953, Chapter Bellville was consecrated in the new Masonic temple in Bellville. Chapter Unie was later consecrated during 1958 in the Spitskop Masonic center in Bloemfontein and it commenced working in Bultfontein. During 1961 all but one Netherlandic Lodge resolved to form the Grand Lodge of South Africa, which was consecrated in Cape Town during that year. As a result of subsequent discussions between the Grand Lodge of South Africa and the Grand Lodge of the Netherlands, Chapters Mutual, Bellville and Unie were eventually removed from the roll of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of the Netherlands on 30 June 1967 and were placed under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of South Africa.

At the Annual General Meeting of the Grand Lodge in 1968 the members voted

to amend its Constitution to give the Grand Lodge the right to confer the additional degrees of Mark Master Mason and Excellent Master Mason in its three Royal Arch Chapters. The Regulations for the proposed Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of South Africa were approved and the three Craft Divisions, being the Southern, the Northern and the Central Divisions donated sufficient money for the formation of this Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter. The proposed rituals for the degrees of Mark Master Mason, Excellent Master Mason and Royal Arch Mason had been prepared and were sent to the local Sister Constitutions and to the Supreme Grand Chapters of England, Ireland, Scotland and the Netherlands for their information.

The Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of South Africa was duly consecrated on 30 August 1969 in this De Goede Hoop Temple. The presiding officer was MEC JEA Salem, the District Grand Superintendent of Rhodesia. The then Grand Master, MW Bro E Conradie, became the first First Grand Principal of this newly consecrated Supreme Grand Chapter. To assist him with this task, the position of Pro First Grand Principal was established and RW Bro H Daleboudt, the Provincial Grand Master of the Southern Division, was appointed to this position. He thereafter translated the ritual of the Royal Arch degree into Afrikaans.

By the end of 1970 MEC Daleboudt had retired as the Pro First Grand Principal due to his appointment as an Assistant Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of South Africa and MEC JJ Strauss was appointed as the Pro First Grand Principal in his stead. Four additional Chapters were consecrated, namely Chapter Dromedaris in Durban, Chapter Johannes Truter in Worcester, Chapter Eendrag Maak Mag in Johannesburg and Chapter Koh – I – Noor in Pretoria.

During 1971 it was resolved that the Supreme Grand Chapter would form three Divisions, namely the Southern Division covering the Western and the Eastern

Cape Provinces; the Central Division covering the Orange Free State and the Natal Provinces and the Northern Division, covering the Transvaal Province. The following Companions were appointed as the first Grand Superintendents of these Provincial Grand Chapters, namely: MEC N. Lewis in the Southern Division, MEC F. Burnard in the Northern Division and MEC B. Parks in the Central Division.

By the end of 1972 a new ritual for the Excellent Masters' degree had been approved and the following seven Chapters had been consecrated, namely Chapter Fiat Lux in Port Elizabeth, Chapter Eastern Free State in Marquard, Chapter De Broederband in Pretoria, Chapter Royal Protea in East London, Chapter Orange in Rustenburg, Chapter Horeb in Krugersdorp and Chapter Witbank in Witbank. By the end of 1975 the following Chapters had been consecrated namely, Chapter Fidelity in Johannesburg, Chapter De Goede Kaap in Cape Town, Chapter Parys in Parys, Chapter Suiderlig in Bellville and Chapter Jubileum Oranje Nassau in Cape Town. This latter Chapter was given dispensation to work in the Dutch language as all its members were Dutch speaking.

By the end of 1983 the Supreme Grand Chapter had approved a past MEZ jewel and the Royal Arch Companion jewel. Chapter Johannes Truter in the Southern Division had relocated from Worcester to Paarl and Chapter Saamwerk had been consecrated in Pietermaritzburg. MW Bro S Gasson had retired as the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of South Africa and MW Bro G Groenewald had been elected and installed his stead.

From 1969 to 1983 the Grand Master had also occupied the position of the First Grand Principal. As a result of discussions between the members of the Grand Committees of the Grand Lodge of South Africa and the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of South Africa, the Regulations of the Supreme Grand

Chapter were amended during 1983 which had the effect that the Grand Master would be the titular head of the Supreme Grand Chapter with the rank of ex officio Honorary First Grand Principal. It was further agreed that the Grand Master would thereafter wear his official Grand Master's regalia to all meetings of the Supreme Grand Chapter when he was on an official visit. The members of the Supreme Grand Chapter would be entitled elect their own First Grand Principal and MEC JJ Kroukamp, who had been the Pro First Grand Principal since 1978, was duly elected and installed as the First Grand Principal of this Supreme Grand Chapter.

During 1985 the Supreme Grand Committee introduced the Meritorious Service Award (MSA) to be awarded to any Companion who was in good standing and who had rendered exceptional service to Royal Arch Freemasonry. The Supreme Grand Chapter Regulations were duly amended and the first MSA was awarded to MEC JJ Kroukamp.

By the end of 1985 two new Chapters had been consecrated, one in the Northern Division being Chapter Colin Graham Botha in Nigel and one in the Central Division, being Chapter Unity in Bloemfontein. During 1986 Chapter Makalani was consecrated in Grootfontein, Namibia and the Supreme Grand Committee received a request from Chapter Parys to change its name to Chapter Sam Greenman in honour of one of its long serving members and a past Grand Superintendent, who had recently passed away. During this year the MSA was awarded to MEC N Lewis and MEC BR Menego.

During 1988 MEC M Levin OSM was elected as the First Grand Principal and the first two Cryptic Councils were consecrated, namely the Bellville Cryptic Council in Bellville and the Eendrag Maak Mag Cryptic Council in Johannesburg. The first two Royal Ark Mariner Lodges were also consecrated,

namely the Eendrag Maak Mag Royal Ark Mariner Lodge in Johannesburg and the De Goede Kaap Royal Ark Mariner Lodge in Cape Town. During this year the MSA was awarded to MEC M Levin OSM, MEC A van Niekerk OSM and MEC SP Kaestner.

During 1989 Chapter Moria was consecrated in Ventersdorp and the newly amended Aldersgate Royal Arch Ritual, as used by the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of England, was adopted as the ritual which this Supreme Grand Chapter would also use and which is still in use, subject to certain amendments made thereto to ensure that it complied with the Regulations of this Supreme Grand Chapter. During this year the MSA was awarded to MEC S Gasson OSM.

During 1991 MEC HPJJ Smit was elected and installed as the First Grand Principal and by the end of 1992 Chapter Oosterlig had been consecrated in Germiston. During 1994 the Supreme Grand Chapter celebrated its 25th anniversary in the De Goede Hoop temple and the then First Grand Principal, MEC N. Rudman, specifically thanked MEC Duckworth, the Grand Superintendent of the District Grand Chapter of the English Constitution and MEC Allwick, the District Grand King of the Irish Constitution for their exceptional and continued support of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of South Africa. The MSA was awarded to MEC HPJJ Smit at this occasion.

During 1997 MEC AAR Alexander OSM was elected and installed as the First Grand Principal. He was succeeded by MEC PJ Naude in 2000. During 2004 Chapters Mutual and Bellville celebrated their Golden Jubilees in Cape Town. During this year the Provincial Grand Chapter, Central Division was integrated into the Northern Division and all Chapters in the Free State and the Kwa – Zulu Natal Provinces still fall under the jurisdiction of the Northern Division.

During 2005 the Pro First Grand Principal of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of the Netherlands visited South Africa and, at the installation of Chapter De Broederband in Pretoria, he conferred the rank of Representative of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of the Netherlands in South Africa on the then First Grand Principal, MEC JP Naude.

During 2006 MEC AGA Rhoodie was elected and installed as the First Grand Principal and by the end of this year Chapter Orange and Chapter Fiat Lux were the strongest Chapters in the Northern and the Southern Divisions, respectively. The Grand Superintendent of the Southern Division, MEC G. Sumner, was honoured by being requested by the English Constitution to attend to the installation ceremony of the first Supreme Ruler of their newly consecrated Secret Monitor Conclave in Cape Town. During this year the MSA was awarded to MEC JP Naude.

During 2008 the Supreme Grand Chapter introduced an information pamphlet on Royal Arch Freemasonry, which was to be presented to all newly raised Master Masons of the Grand Lodge of South Africa to encourage them to consider becoming Royal Arch Freemasons. It further approved a guide for newly elected Most Excellent Zerubbabels to assist them to lead their Chapters during their term of office.

During 2009 MEC N Klein OSM was elected and installed as the First Grand Principal. He was succeeded by MEC WF Prentzler in 2012 and he awarded the MSA to MEC J Cronje during 2013 and to MEC H Archer during 2014. During 2015 MEC JJ Britz was elected and installed as the First Grand Principal. During this year the Fidelity Royal Ark Mariner Lodge was consecrated in Johannesburg and the current amended rituals for the degrees of Mark Master Mason and Excellent Master Mason were approved and introduced.

Shortly thereafter the Grand Committee of the Grand Lodge of South Africa

determined that the First Grand Principal would be entitled to wear his full Royal Arch regalia to the Annual General Meeting of the Grand Lodge to confirm the close relationship which exists between the Grand Lodge of South Africa and the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of South Africa. The first dedicated office space for the Supreme Grand Scribe E was further established in the De Goede Hoop Masonic complex in Cape Town, which has proved to be most successful.

Although several Chapters have, during the past more than 50 years, been forced to return their Charters for a variety of reasons, the following Royal Arch Chapters, Royal Ark Mariner Lodges and Cryptic Councils were consecrated during 2018 in the Northern Division following their resignation from the Supreme Grand Chapter of Scotland, namely Chapter Acacia in Pretoria, Chapter Brixton in Kensington, Chapter Golden Thistle and Chapter St. Andrew in Orange Grove, Chapter Amajuba in Secunda, the Acacia Royal Ark Mariner Lodge in Pretoria, the Brixton Royal Ark Mariner Lodge in Kensington, the Acacia Cryptic Council in Pretoria and the Brixton Cryptic Council in Kensington.

During 2018 the current Regulations for this Supreme Grand Chapter were approved and introduced and the MSA was awarded to MEC JEH Smith OSM. During 2019 the Supreme Grand Chapter celebrated its Golden Jubilee and held its Rededication Ceremony in the De Goede Hoop Temple in Cape Town. Its guests included the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of South Africa, MW Bro David Duncan OSM. Representatives of several foreign Supreme Grand Chapters were in attendance including the First Grand Principal of the Netherlands, MEC Van Doorn, who gave an interesting address on the history of Royal Arch Freemasonry in South Africa from their perspective. MEC A Jacobson was awarded the MSA on this occasion.

During 2020 Chapters Eendrag Maak Mag, Johannes Truter, Dromedaris and

Koh-i-Noor were prevented by the World – wide Covid Pandemic from celebrating their Golden Jubilees, which then took place during 2021. After completing two terms of office as the First Grand Principal of this Supreme Grand Chapter, MEC JJ Britz retired in 2021 and MEC JEH Smith OSM MSA, the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of South Africa, was elected as the First Grand Principal. He was installed during February 2022 at which event he presented the MSA to MEC JJ Britz.

During 2022 Chapter Unie was reopened in Parys in the Free State and it is working in Welkom. During 2023 Chapter Jeffreys Bay was consecrated in Jeffreys Bay, Eastern Cape Province. During this year Chapter Fidelity in Johannesburg celebrated its Golden Jubilee and MEC Brian Masencamp retired as the Grand Superintendent of the Northern Division. The First Grand Principal appointed and installed MEC Marius Mostert as the

Grand Superintendent of the Northern Division. MEC Mahmoud Patel retired as the Grand Superintendent of the Southern Division and the First Grand Principal appointed and installed MEC Louis van der Linde as the Grand Superintendent of the Southern Division. Chapter De Goede Kaap in Cape Town celebrated its Golden Jubilee.

During 2024 the Grand Master, MW Bro Godfrey Place, represented the Supreme Grand Chapter at the installation of the new Grand Master and First Grand Principal of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Benin. MEC Petrus Naude MSA, a member of Chapter Witbank, was awarded his fifty (50) year long service certificate and jewel. MEC John Smith OSM MSA retired as the First Grand Principal and he installed MEC Avron Jacobson MSA as the next First Grand Principal at the annual convocation of the Supreme Grand Chapter in the De Goede Hoop temple.

ANNUAL REPORT / JAARVERSLAG (16/09/2023-28/09/2024).

Dear Grand Master, MW Bro Godfrey Place; the First Grand Principal, MEC John Smith OSM MSA; Most Excellent Companions, Excellent Companions and Companions all. A special word of welcome is extended to all distinguished Craftsmen and Companions who honour us by their presence this morning. During September 2023 I was installed as the Grand Superintendent of this Provincial Grand Chapter and it is my honour and privilege to present this, my first annual report.

On 18 November 2023 the 50-year Rededication ceremony of Chapter De Goede Kaap no16 took place together with its Installation. I had granted dispensation for the meeting to move to the Saturday as time would be too short for all the ceremonies on a week night. Supreme Grand Chapter attended to the Rededication Ceremony, which was performed by the First Grand Principal and his Officers. Provincial Grand Chapter (SD) proceeded with the Installation of the MEZ, EC Alex Costopoulos; EH, Companion Jonathan Curtis and EJ, Companion Bradley Bordiss

The Installation of Chapter Mutual was held on 28 November 2023 and EC S Rogovsky was installed as the MEZ. Companion A van Dijk as EH and Companion C Engelke as EJ. The Provincial Grand Chapter Officers all performed well in their new appointments. During the Installation Ceremony, the First Grand Principal again attended to the Boards of Installed Mark Master Mason and Installed Worshipful and Excellent Master.

On 30 November 2023 I was installed as the Commander Noah of the De Goede Kaap Royal Ark Mariner Lodge by the First Grand Principal and Officers of Supreme Grand Chapter. On this occasion he also symbolically installed several senior members of the Sister Constitutions which then enabled them to attend the whole installation ceremony.

The 2023 year ended with the usual Excellent Masters' Degree at Chapter Johannes Truter in Worcester, which is dubbed the "Christmas Working" and at the Festive Board, the start of the Festive Season was celebrated. The evening was well attended and both Supreme Grand Chapter and Provincial Grand Chapter were represented.

On 6 April 2024 a joint installation was held with Chapter Fiat Lux no.8 and Chapter Jeffreys Bay no. 28 in Port Alfred and EC Hendrik Rademeyer was installed as the MEZ, while MEC Hutton OSM was installed as EH and EC R Gilmer as EJ of Chapter Fiat Lux. EC Dirk Uys was installed as the MEZ, while MEC Hutton OSM was installed as EH and EC A Venter as the EJ of Chapter Jeffreys Bay.

On 01 June 2024 I attended the Annual Convocation of the Provincial Grand Chapter

Northern Division in Orange Grove and, as always, we were warmly received and enjoyed the celebrations with our Companions from up country. At all these occasions mentioned above, it was a most enjoyable experience to meet with so many of my Companions who are largely responsible for the success of Royal Arch Freemasonry. The cordial receptions, generous hospitality and delightful friendliness on all occasions have left me with many pleasant memories. A huge thank you to all involved in the arrangements of the different events and I am looking forward to visiting you again soon.

I particularly wish to mention that on 17 July 2024 the Provincial Grand Master of the Provincial Grand Lodge (SD), RW Bro Raymond Eyiomen, was admitted as a Mark Master Mason in Chapter De Goede Kaap.

The continued visiting of members between Chapters De Goede Kaap and Mutual has ensured that both Chapters can have been able to perform their workings with enough members present to ensure that the candidates receive a meaningful experience.

Both the De Goede Kaap Royal Ark Mariner Lodge and the Belville Cryptic Council are active and have attracted 5 and 8 new members respectively. It gives me great pleasure to report that our Past Grand Master and Past FGP Conferred, MW Bro and MEC Geoff Edwards OSM, has joined both the De Goede Kaap RAM and the Belville Cryptic Council and we wish him a long and happy sojourn in these Orders.

Chapter Mutual has adopted an advancement criteria which similar to that being practiced in the Grand Lodge of South Africa. Mark Master Masons and Excellent Master Masons must attend at least two workings of their own degree at their own Chapter and must have visited at least twice at other Chapters of our own Constitution or those of our Sister Constitutions. Further they are required to learn some parts of the Ritual given to them and participate in these workings. Before advancing to the next degree, candidates must submit an essay on their understanding of the degree. With this approach the Chapter is confident that their members will have a good understanding of the various degrees and our Order and will remain faithful members thereof.

Chapter Jeffreys Bay was consecrated during April 2023 with 10 petitioners and rapidly grew

to 18 members within a year. Unfortunately, the expulsion of EC James Lidderd Snr from the Order has resulted in various resignations. As he was the main driving force in the Chapter, activities have drastically slowed down. To make matters worse the MEZ, EC Dirk Uys suffered ill health and subsequently was called to the Grand Chapter above. We are discussing plans to relocate the Chapter to the Masonic temple in Humansdorp as the members have been locked out of the temple in Jeffreys Bay. I am hoping that with the appointment of MEC Keith Hutton OSM as a Third Grand Principal by the new First Grand Principal and my appointing EC Nowellyn van Vuuren as my Assistant Grand Superintendent in the Eastern Cape, they will take charge of matters in there and the Chapter will soon get back on track.

Chapter Fiat Lux has taken the decision to relocate from the Port Alfred temple to the new Masonic temple of the Provincial Grand Lodge of the Eastern Cape Division in Port Elizabeth (Gqeberha) as most of their members are from there. I must thank EC Marius Terblanche, the Scribe E of this Chapter, for always taking good care of this Chapter.

I appointed EC Stephane Rogovsky as our Provincial Grand Scribe Ezra in 2023 and I would be remiss not to thank him most sincerely for his dedication to this Provincial Grand Chapter. Today, soon to be MEC Stephane Rogovsky will start his new Sojourn as the Grand Scribe Ezra, and I can assure him of our support in his new position. As a result, EC Stephane Rogovsky has agreed to remain as the Acting Provincial Grand Scribe Ezra until such time as I can obligate and invest Companion Avron Lukas as the Provincial Grand Scribe E, being a member of special Talent. This will done be as soon as he is installed as the Excellent Joshua of Chapter De Goede Kaap in November 2023.

Administration.

Our administration is sound, and we are able to respond to the invitations from Sister Constitutions and requests for dispensations much quicker now. With the use of the G-Suite for the Grand Superintendent and Provincial Grand Scribe E, our record keeping has improved and future generations will be able to find all agendas, minutes, correspondence and relevant information on Google Docs. We are

also able to communicate with all our members via WhatsApp in our PGC SD Community and share vital information, reminders of events etc there.

Finances.

My sincere thanks to MEC Dawie van Rooyen for his excellent management of our finances. MEC Van Rooyen has agreed to assist in this position for one more year, but I will need to find a Companion to take over from him soon and for this reason I have appointed EC Anthony van Dijk as the assistant Provincial Grand Treasurer, being a person of Special Talent. Our finances are on a sound basis and this Division has paid all its dues.

Ritual Excellence.

The roll out of the Supreme Grand Chapter Ritual Excellence Program was delayed and will be implemented in the next Masonic year. This has not deterred some members from committing charges to memory. EC Stephane Rogovsky has committed the charges of the Wor. Mark Master in the Mark Master Mason degree and those of the Wor & Ex Master in the Excellent Master degree to memory and never had a ritual book in front of him during these ceremonies. In addition to that, he recites the Lecture in the Mark Master Mason degree faultlessly.

Companion Kelvin Irvine, who was recently advanced to Excellent Master has shown that he will be a contender for a Ritualist pin and has performed the charges of Junior Overseer in the Mark Master Mason degree with great enthusiasm and commitment.

MEC Cobis Wilson has become the roving Conductor in this Division and assists most Chapters in this position and does so from memory. As the Acting Provincial Grand Second Principal, he has done all the charges assigned to him in this regard from memory.

EC Malcolm Gessler was appointed as Provincial Grand Third Principal at the previous Annual Convocation and had less than 14 days to learn all the charges assigned to him in that role before participating in his first installation.

I challenged some of my PGC Officers to learn the address to the Companions of the

Installation Ritual and both EC Steven Botha and EC Stephan Rogovsky delivered perfect charges in this regard.




